TET BRINGS SMILES TO MILE SQUARE PARK

Reinvigorated New Year's event gets kudos for being close to Little Saigon

FOUNTAIN VALLEY » Organizers who brought the Tet festival back to Mile Square Park after a year as a one-night event had hoped to draw 15,000 people. It was closer to double that as the community showed up in big numbers for three days of carnival rides, food and entertainment to ring in the Year of the Dog.

While the more established Tet Festival in Costa Mesa continued to draw strong crowds, many residents from the Little Sai-

gon community were happy to have the event close to home, not to mention free, at Mile Square.

Edmond Tong, 35, of Stanton, who performs a Vietnamese offshoot of Wushu 18 Forms martial arts in numerous locales, was happy to see Tet back in Fountain Valley.

"For the community, the more events the better," he said.

Tong's view echoed that of Supervisor Andrew Do, whose office took over the weekend event, with a new company providing the entertainment. The festival ran into financial problems after moving from Garden Grove to Fountain Valley in 2016 and was shortened to one night last year. Do estimated the event would cost about \$200,000, and with Orange County controlling the purse strings, there won't be

any surprises.

Not only was admission to the event free, but the county waived the normal \$5 parking charge for visitors.

"I think having it here right near the heart of Vietnamese community makes it more like home," said Dylan Nguyen, 19, of Huntington Beach.

"I think it's great. It's close by and it's accessible," said Ryan Tran, 25 of Westminster, who accompanied his sister, Rochelle, 13, for her martial arts performance.

This was Rochelle Tran's first time performing at Fountain Valley, and she said it "made sense," as a venue.

Nguyen was with

DMLHD, or Doi Mua Lan Hung Dao, a group of lion dancers from Huntington Beach. Surrounded by hundreds of spectators, the dancers performed in the Hok San style, a more showy, embellished and aggressive style of the traditional lion dance.

"Most of what we do is spread culture," Nguyen said. "We came out here just to have fun. This gives a lot of opportunity for people to be exposed to our culture."

As the dancers finished up their routine and collected dollar bills from the appreciative crowd, Nguyen said they were packing up to perform at a couple of private New Year's parties.

Throughout the Mile Square Park venue, the smell of pho and other traditional Vietnamese food wafted and intermingled with hamburgers and ket-

tle corn. More than 200 vendors set up tents, offering everything from bonsai trees to insurance. At a tent run by Cal Optima health care, a line of 50 or more stretched throughout the afternoon as residents waited to spin a wheel to win water bottles, gel pads or tote bags.

Sean Ly, 37, of Santa Ana brought his family and 4-year-old son, Dylan, who was dressed in a matching, vibrant red Vietnamese traditional shirt.

For the Ly family, Tet is about visiting temples and family gatherings.

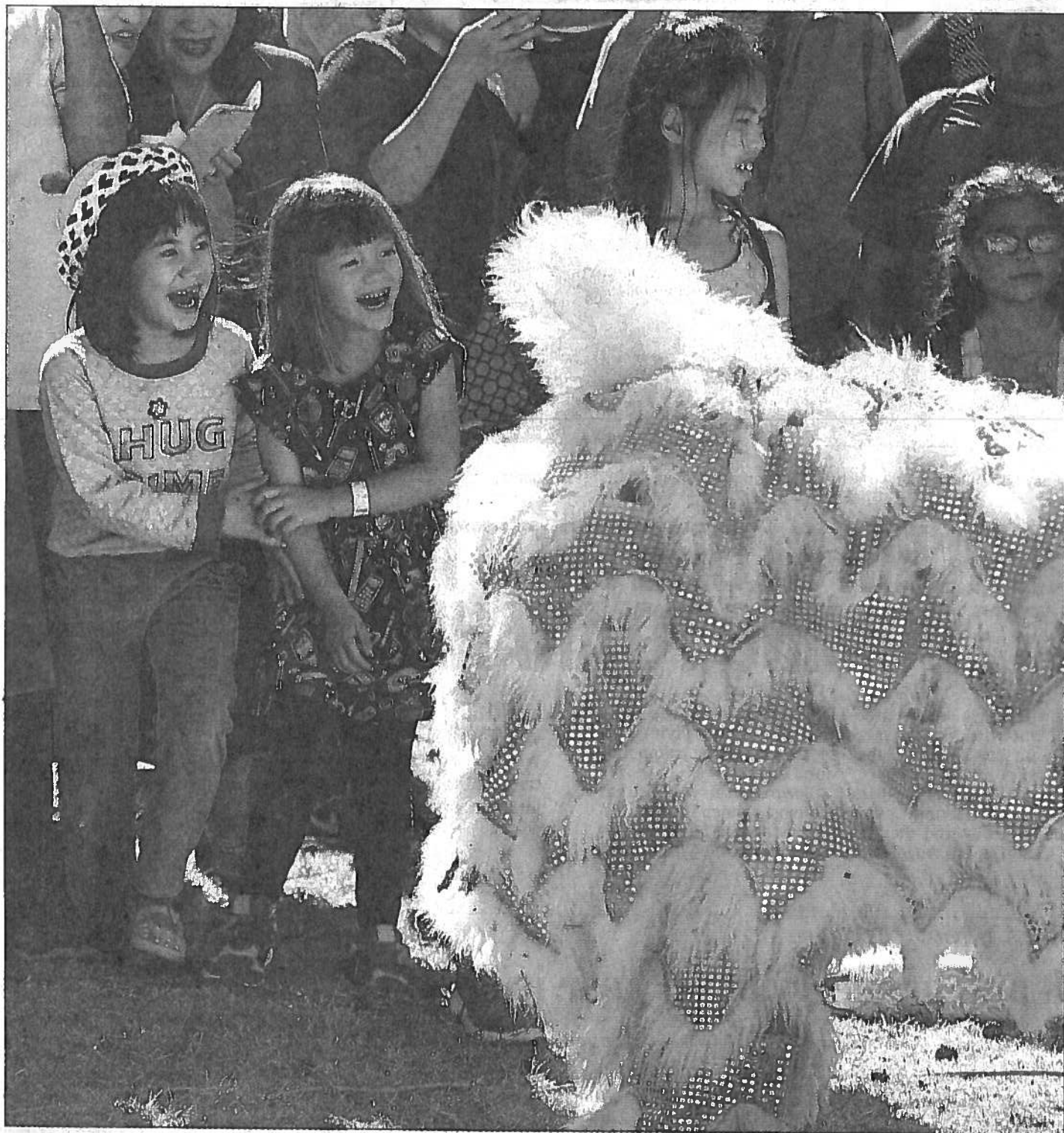
"It's nice to have," Sean Ly said of the community event. "It's once a year when we get to see each other."

He also said the price was right.

"It's nice they don't charge admission," he said. "I hope they keep it."

Two from Santiago High take first place in OC

Santiago High School students Mauricio Rey and Antonio Leana took home first place in the Orange County Dealers Association High School Automotive Competition held at Kia Motors of American in Irvine on Feb. 10.

The pair of automotive technology students beat out 120 students from other districts across Orange County in a previous competition, to qualify for the final round and took home the championship against the county's top six teams.

To win the competition, students were tasked with troubleshooting a Lexus Sedan which had been rigged with many errors, including shorted fuses and broken parts. The Santiago team, coached by teacher Carlos Sanchez and a coach from Lexus of Westminster, used diagnostic equipment to fix the most errors in the fastest amount of time.

"We are so proud of our Santiago students for the dedication, teamwork, and problem-solving skills it took to troubleshoot

"Our hearts are breaking for the school community in Parkland, Florida today as they cope with the loss suffered due to this senseless act of violence," read a Feb. 14 message on GGUSD's Facebook page. "All flags across our district are at half-staff to honor the lives lost. We encourage parents to talk to their children about violence and we thank our community for your partnership in keeping our students safe. Emergency preparedness and school safety are our highest priorities. Here is a helpful resource from the National Association of School Psychologists about talking to your children about violence."

A week after the murder of 17 children at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Florida, people across the country are still grieving, praying, reaching out, and grappling with a pressing question: How do we keep our children as safe as possible?

As usual, we're seeing what should be a debate — yes, we should and must talk about it — devolve into political tribalism.

We know, nearly 20 years after Columbine, how that works out.

We'd like to hear from students, parents, educators, law enforcement, all community members.

Garden Grove man arrested after posting 'rage and hate' on Facebook

GARDEN GROVE — A man was arrested Sunday night, Feb. 18, after making disturbing posts on Facebook indicating he posed a potential danger to the public, authorities said.

Shortly before 10 p.m., officers were contacted by a family member of 46-year-old Mark William Flicker of Garden Grove. The relative expressed concern about erratic Facebook posts from Flicker, adding he had ongoing family issues and had been drinking heavily, police said in a statement.

“Officers were shown the posts made by Flicker,” the statement says. “Those posts appeared to indicate that Flicker could potentially pose a danger to the public. Flicker did not specifically threaten any specific person, business, or place, but indicated he had ordered a firearm online and that he was full of rage and hate.”

As officers were preparing to go to Flicker’s residence, they received a phone call from another family member, who stated Flicker had gone to his mother’s residence in the 12900 block of Sylvan Street in Garden Grove to retrieve a firearm from a gun safe, the statement says.

As officers began arriving in the area, Flicker walked out of the residence and was detained.

Police determined Flicker had unsuccessfully attempted to open the gun safe without his mother’s permission, says the statement. He was arrested on suspicion of burglary and attempted grand theft of firearms and booked into the Orange County Jail. Bail was set at \$2 million.

Police along with the Orange County District Attorney’s Office served Flicker with a firearms emergency protective order preventing him from legally possessing any guns pending further investigation. Early Monday, officers served a search warrant at Flicker’s residence and recovered several electronic devices, but did not find any firearms.

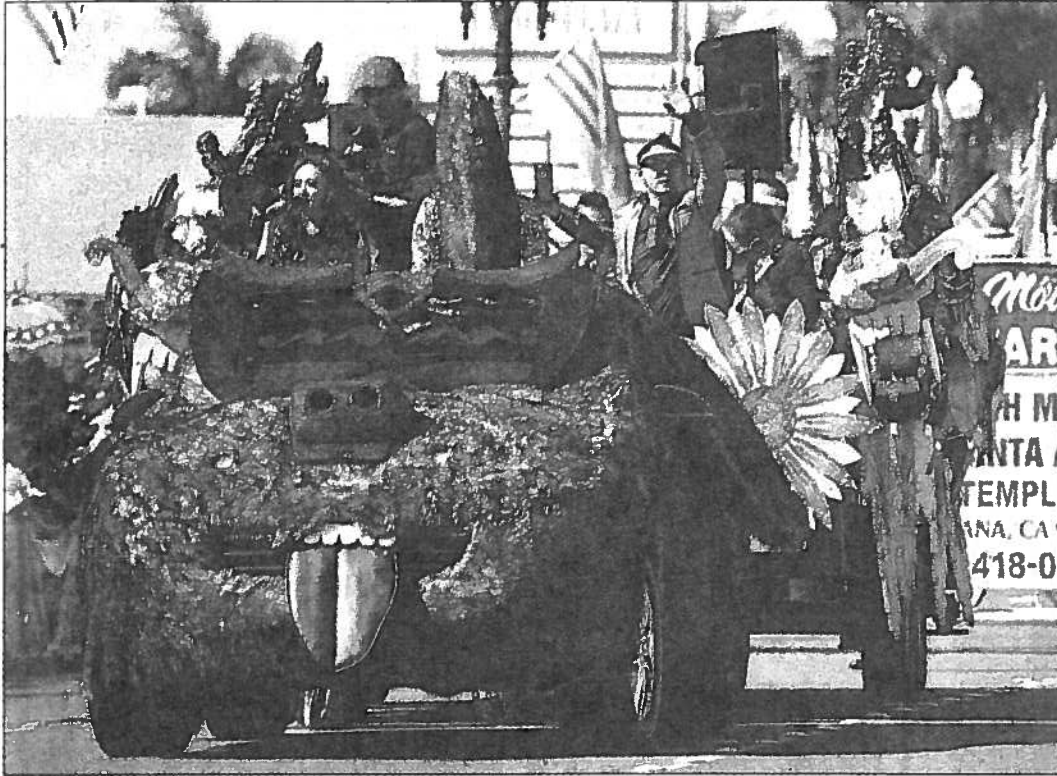

Tet parade tips off in Little Saigon to tune of beating drums, lion dances

Revelers in Orange County's Little Saigon kicked off the Year of the Dog on Saturday with a parade featuring colorfully costumed dancers, uniformed military veterans and of course, dogs.

Westminster and Garden Grove police handlers walked their K-9s and waved to a crowd of thousands that lined Bolsa

Avenue for the annual Tet parade, which marks the lunar New Year.

Troupes of children beat drums and clashed cymbals as others in fringed outfits performed the traditional lion dance, ending in a cacophony of firecrackers.

Women in gem-hued dresses and men in gold-patterned tunics carried the flags of America and Vietnam as an announcer introduced local dignitaries and wished everyone a

happy new year.

Annam Tran, 18, and Steven Nguyen, 17, both of Westminster, were among the lion dance performers. They can do about 10 tricks under their shared lion costume, but they had to learn to communicate with hand gestures because of noise from the crowd and firecrackers, Tran said.

The fun part is "being able to do the tricks and see the audience's reaction," Nguyen said.

They'll be performing throughout the weekend as well as spending time with family.

The military was well represented at the parade, which included a replica battleship with uniformed sailors saluting from the deck.

"As a Vietnam veteran, I just like to see the people

Even though Tran's husband and 5-year-old son were born in the U.S., she said, "Our culture is still Vietnamese."

Lunar New Year candles spark fire that damages home

GARDEN GROVE » Candles left unattended on a table to commemorate the Lunar New Year caused a fire early Friday that led to an estimated \$80,000 in damage to a home and its contents, authorities said.

When firefighters responded shortly after 2:35 a.m., they found the single-story home, in the 11700 block of Donna Lane, in flames, said Capt. Thanh Nguyen of the Garden Grove Fire Department.

The blaze began after lit candles left on a table outside of the house set the structure on fire, he said, with the fire spreading to the attic.

"We would like everyone to celebrate safely and not leave lit candles unattended," Chief Tom Schultz said. "A safe alternative is battery-powered candles."

The blaze was contained in about 20 minutes. Six adults and two children were displaced but not injured, Nguyen said.

Fatal accident

A pedestrian died last Friday morning, Feb. 9, after apparently trying to run across the 22 Freeway in Garden Grove and getting hit by a pickup truck.

At around 5:40 a.m., the California Highway Patrol received a report of a man running across the westbound lanes of the 22 at Beach Boulevard in Garden Grove and then getting struck.

Investigators were trying to determine why the man ran across the freeway. The driver, a man from Corona, stayed at the scene and cooperated with investigators, police said.

All westbound lanes were closed during part of the CHP's investigation; by 8 p.m., they had all re-opened.

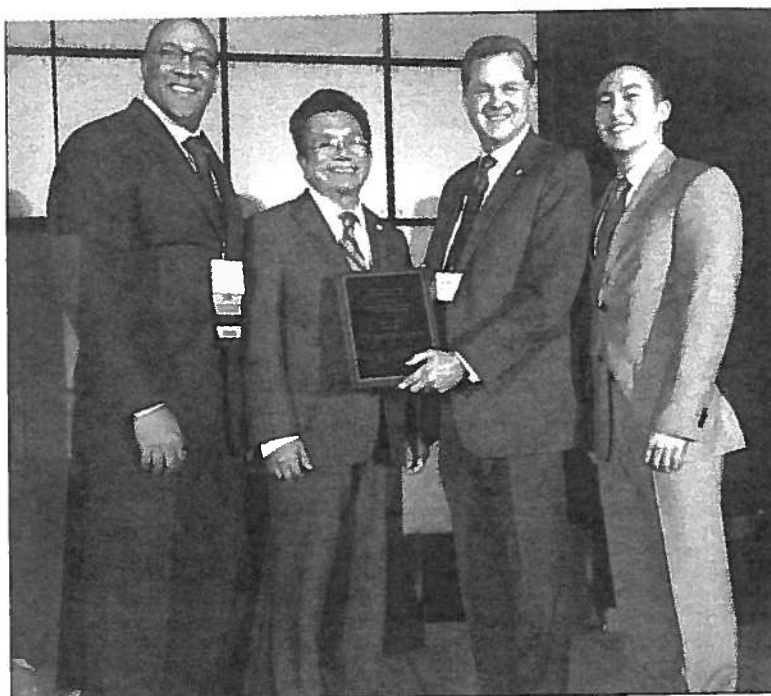
The City of Garden Grove was recently recognized with the Advancement of Diverse Communities award, presented during the League of California Cities Awards Luncheon in Newport Beach.

CITRUS GREENING DISEASE DISCOVERED IN GARDEN GROVE

City Asks Residents to Cooperate with Agriculture Officials

The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) and the United States Department of Agriculture have discovered Huanglongbing, also known as HLB or citrus greening disease, in Garden Grove. HLB kills citrus trees and has no cure. The disease is not harmful to humans or animals.

Anaheim has the highest incidences of confirmed HLB-infected citrus trees in Orange County, followed by Garden Grove.

The HLB quarantine map for Orange County is available online at www.cdfa.ca.gov/plant/pe/InteriorExclusion/hlb_quarantine.html.

Agricultural officials are going door-to-door to access backyard citrus trees to inspect for the presence of the Asian citrus psyllid, a small insect that feeds on citrus tree leaves, causing HLB to spread.

The City of Garden Grove asks residents to cooperate with the CDFA and the United States Department of Agriculture with their detection and eradication efforts.

Treatments are the most effective way to protect citrus trees from the Asian citrus psyllid, which helps prevent the spread of HLB. Officials will have a badge or patch indicating their affiliation with CDFA, will never ask to access the inside of the home, and will never ask for payment for their services. For specific questions about the treatments, please call (800) 491-1899.

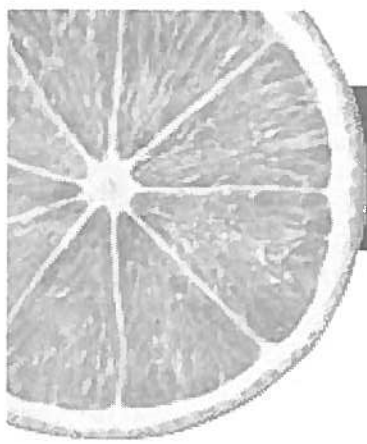
If trees test positive for HLB, they will be removed to prevent the spread of HLB. The removal will be done by agricultural officials at no cost.

Signs of citrus greening disease are: asymmetrical patterns of yellow leaves, color inversion, and corky veins.

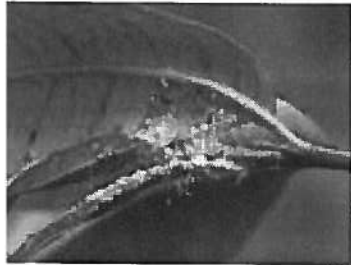

A Deadly Plant Disease and Dangerous Pest Have Been Found in California

The California citrus we all know and love is at risk. A devastating plant disease called Huanglongbing, also known as HLB or citrus greening, has been found in Southern California. HLB kills citrus trees and there is no cure. Diseased trees produce bitter, hard and lopsided fruit, and eventually die. The disease is spread by a pest called the Asian citrus psyllid as it feeds from tree to tree. Psyllids are small, about the size of an aphid, and can be seen on the small, tender, new leaves of citrus trees. The best way to protect California citrus from the disease is to stop the spread of the pest.

We All Play a Critical Role:

- Inspect your citrus trees monthly for the pest and disease.
- Do not move citrus plants, leaves or foliage in or out of your community, or across state or international borders.
- Cooperate with agriculture crews placing traps, inspecting trees and treating for the pest.
- Talk to your local nursery or garden center about products that can protect your tree from the Asian citrus psyllid.
- Plant citrus trees from reputable, licensed nurseries in your area.
- When grafting trees, only buy registered budwood with source documentation.
- Control ants on your citrus trees. Ants interfere with beneficial insects and actually protect the Asian citrus psyllid. Talk to your local nursery about ant bait that can help.
- If you no longer wish to care for your citrus tree, consider removing it so it does not become a host to the pest and disease.
- If you suspect your tree has the psyllid or disease, act fast! Call the California Department of Food and Agriculture at 800-491-1899.

감귤그린병 (Huanglongbing)으로 불리는 식물병의 전 세계적인 확산이 계속되면서 전 세계 감귤 나무들이 위협에 처해 있는 지금, 수십 년에 걸쳐 캘리포니아에서 재배되어온 감귤 나무들을 보호하기 위한 캘리포니아 주민들의 주의가 요구되고 있습니다.

감귤그린병 (HLB, 감귤녹화병 (yellow dragon disease)라고도 불림)은 감귤 나무들에게는 치명적입니다. 나무가 한번 감염되면 치료 방법도 없이 죽게 됩니다.

이 질병은 아시안 감귤 실리드 (Asian citrus psyllid)라는 해충을 통해 전염되고 (감귤 나무들의 나뭇잎과 줄기를 갉아먹으며 병균을 옮김), 눈접용 접가지 또는 대목과 같이 감염된 나무 조각을 접목시킴으로써 전염되기도 합니다.

감귤 나무들을 보호하고 귤, 오렌지, 포멜로, 시트론, 금귤, 레몬과 같은 건강한 과일을 평소처럼 계속해서 집에서 기르려면, 감귤나무 식물과 증식용 재료들을 믿을 수 있는 곳에서 구매해야 합니다.

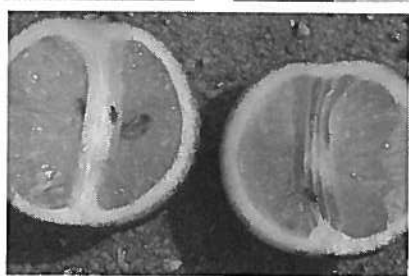
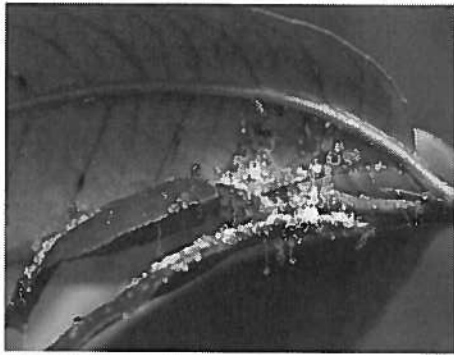

Trồng Cây Cam Quýt Lành Mạnh và Bảo Vệ Cây Cối California

Dịch lây lan toàn cầu của chứng bệnh cây cối gọi là Huanglongbing đang là hiểm họa đe dọa cây cối trên toàn thế giới, và cư dân California nên cẩn thận bảo vệ giống cây cam quýt đã được trồng ở California từ bao nhiêu đời.

Huanglongbing, còn được biết đến với tên HLB, hay gọi là bệnh rỗng vàng, gây tử họa cho cây cối giống cam quýt. Một khi cây bị nhiễm bệnh, cây sẽ chết và không có cách cứu chữa.

Căn bệnh này bị lây lan bởi một loại sâu bọ gọi là Asian citrus psyllid – có thể lây truyền bệnh trong lúc chúng ăn lá và cuống của giống cây cam quýt – và lây bệnh qua việc ghép cây.

Để bảo vệ giống cây cam quýt ở địa phương và bảo đảm rằng chúng có thể phát triển lành mạnh và kết trái như trái quýt, cam, bưởi, chanh, tất tại nhà, mua giống cây cam quýt và vật liệu tại các nơi có uy tín.

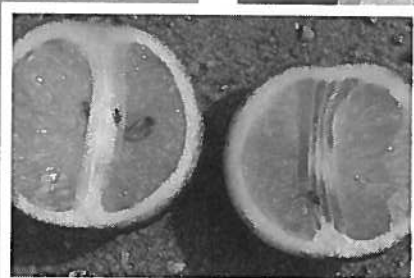
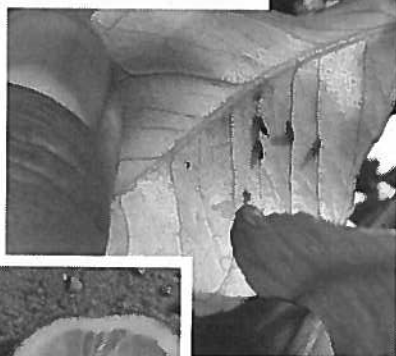
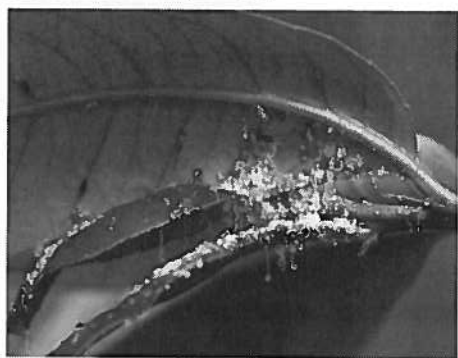

Salve los frutos cítricos de su comunidad

Una enfermedad mortal de las plantas y una plaga peligrosa se han encontrado en California

Los frutos cítricos de California que tanto nos gustan y disfrutamos están en peligro. En el sur de California se encontró una enfermedad devastadora de las plantas llamada Huanglongbing, también conocida como HLB o enverdecimiento de los cítricos. La enfermedad HLB mata los árboles de cítricos y no tiene cura. Los árboles enfermos producen fruta amarga, dura y deforme, y mueren con el tiempo. El insecto llamado psílido asiático de los cítricos transmite la enfermedad HLB propagándola de árbol en árbol conforme se alimenta de las hojas. El psílido asiático de los cítricos es pequeño, como del tamaño de un áfido, y se puede ver en los brotes nuevos y tiernos de los árboles de frutos cítricos. La mejor manera de proteger de la enfermedad a los árboles de cítricos de California, es encontrar y parar la plaga para que no se propague.

La participación de todos es muy importante:

- Inspeccione sus árboles de cítricos una vez al mes en busca de la plaga y la enfermedad.
- No transporte plantas de cítricos, hojas o ramas en su misma zona, ni las lleve a otras partes, estados o países.
- Coopere con las cuadrillas de agricultura que instalan trampas, inspeccionan árboles y aplican tratamientos contra la plaga.
- Platique con el personal de su vivero o centro de jardinería local para conocer cuáles productos pueden ayudar a proteger sus árboles contra el psílido asiático de los cítricos.
- Plante árboles de frutos cítricos adquiridos en viveros con licencia y de buena reputación en su zona.
- Cuando haga injertos, solo compre yemas con registro y documentación de origen.
- Controle las hormigas en sus árboles de cítricos. Las hormigas interfieren con los insectos beneficiosos y protegen al psílido asiático de los cítricos. Platique con el personal de su vivero local para que le recomienden cebos para controlar hormigas.
- Si usted ya no desea cuidar sus árboles de cítricos, considere sacarlos de raíz para que no se conviertan en foco para la plaga y la enfermedad HLB.
- Si sospecha que sus árboles tienen psílicos o la enfermedad ¡haga algo rápido! Llame al Departamento de Alimentos y Agricultura de California al **800-491-1899**.


