



Election Day gunman was Garden Grove employee

Carlos Mendez, who shot three people in Azusa, seemed low-key, co-workers say.

garden grove • The 45year-old man who shot three people, one fatally, in Azusa on Election Day worked as a street-maintenance worker for the city of Garden Grove, officials confirmed Nov. 10.

Carlos Mendez of Azusa spent 10 years working for the city's Public Works Department and had asked his bosses for time off the week of the shooting and standoff with police.

"The Friday before (the shooting), he called in sick. And Monday he asked for a week off," city spokeswoman Ana Pulido said.

"He was always courteous," she said. "He was very quiet, but he never gave any indication there was anything wrong."

Mendez stepped out of a house and opened fire randomly at around 2 p.m. Tuesday in a quiet Azusa neighborhood, police said. Two voting areas were nearby, at a park and school.

Mendez, who investigators later said was on a cocaine binge, started shooting into the street at random people and cars, Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department officials said.

Mendez, a former member of the military, was a gun enthusiast who had been using cocaine at least a day earlier as well, prompting his wife and two children to leave their home Monday evening, reportedly when he became unstable.

The man shot a woman in a van, causing it to crash, police said, then walked up to a 77-year-old man who had stepped outside his home to see what was hap-

pening and shot and killed him. He went on to shoot another woman who was down the street. Both women were critically injured.

Mendez remained inside the house for hours during a standoff with police who eventually shot and killed him. Investigators discovered a shotgun, a handgun and hundreds of rounds of ammunition.

At work, Mendez did graffiti removal, spruced up public rights-of-way and cleaned up after traffic accidents, said Bill Murray, the Public Works Department's director.

"We were all floored," he said of what occurred in Azusa.

Pulido said those who worked alongside Mendez regarded him as a good employee: "There were never any incidents here or problems. You just never know."

Gunman In Deadly Shooting Near Azusa Polling Places Was High On Cocaine

November 9, 2016 8:39 AM

AZUSA (CBSLS.com/AP) — A gunman was binging on drugs when he randomly opened fire Tuesday in a peaceful Azusa neighborhood, killing a neighbor and wounding two women before police shot him, authorities said Wednesday.

The 45yearold man was found dead in the entryway to an Azusa home, ending an hourslong standoff east of Los Angeles. His name wasn't immediately released.

The shooting that erupted at around 2 p.m. Tuesday closed two nearby polling places at a park and elementary school in the San Gabriel Valley However, the shooting "had nothing to do with the ballot or voting," Los Angeles County sheriff's Lt. John Corina said.

The man, who told his family that he used to be in the military, was a "gun fanatic" who began binging on drugs at least a day earlier, prompting his wife and two children to leave their home Monday evening "because he was getting out of control," Corina said.

The man's wife reported that he was on cocaine, but authorities think it could have been methamphetamine or another drug, Corina said.

Police were called to the home Monday night about a disturbance involving the man but had no probably cause to arrest him, Corina said, adding that he had no other details about the call.

On Tuesday afternoon, the man grabbed at least three of his guns, including an assault rifle, and attacked, Corina said.

"According to witnesses he came out into the street with guns and just started shooting randomly at people and cars," he said.

The man shot a woman who was driving a van, which later crashed, then walked up to a neighbor who had stepped outside to see what was happening and shot and killed him, authorities said.

The neighbor was identified Wednesday as 77yearold Francis Varney.

The gunman also shot another woman who was outside down the street, according to a Sheriff's Department statement.

When police from Azusa and neighboring Irwindale arrived to help the victims, the man popped out of hiding and opened fire on them with an assault rifle. The officers weren't hit and fired back, Corina said.

The man went to a home, where he died in the entryway but was only confirmed dead hours later. Weapons including a shotgun and handgun along with about 1,000 rounds of ammunition were found in the home, Corina said.

The wounded women, who are 59 and 65 years old and shot in the face and torso, respectively, were hospitalized in critical condition.

"The doctor said last night that it didn't look good, but I think they're progressing better this morning," Corina said. "They're still alive.

Corina said investigators suspect the shooter was lying about having served in the military. He worked in the public works division for the city of Garden Grove in Orange County, Corina said.

GARDEN GROVE ANIMAL CARE SERVICES COMING JANUARY 1, 2017

The City of Garden Grove will launch its new Garden Grove Animal Care

Services program on January 1, 2017. The new program replaces services provided

by Orange County Animal Care.

Garden Grove's newest program involves a partnership between the City and the Orange County Humane Society. All animal field services and dog licensing will be provided by Garden Grove Animal Care Services, a division within the City's Public Works Department. Animal shelter services will be provided by the Orange County Humane Society.

"This is a great program not only for the City, but for all pet owners," said Garden Grove City Manager Scott Stiles, adding, "Pets are a huge part of our residents' lives, and we plan to provide owners with the best services possible."

The City Council unanimously approved creation of this new program on April 26, 2016, which is expected to save the City about \$9 million over the span of 10 years.

For 2017, the City will honor all animal registration fees paid to OC Animal Care in 2016. When the license issued by OC Animal Care expires, the City will mail out a notice and issue a new tag with a Garden Grove specific number. All licenses for pets will need to be renewed online or through the mail.

All dogs over four months of age, kept in Garden Grove, must be licensed and have a current rabies vaccination. Dogs are required to wear a license tag at all times, attached to a collar or harness. Garden Grove Animal Care Services will pick up stray dogs from the streets and give them provisional shelter.







League Establishes Strategic Goals for 2017

Approximately 107 leaders of the League of California Cities' divisions, departments, policy committees, diversity groups and board of directors meet in Newport Beach on Nov. 10 – 11 and participated in an interactive workshop to develop and set the League's 2017 strategic goals.

The workshop involved city officials from throughout California and built on the success of prior years while developing a guide for 2017 as well.

The adopted goals are as follows:

- Increase Funding for Critical Transportation and Water Infrastructure. Provide
 additional state and federal funding and local financing tools such as reducing the vote
 threshold for local initiatives to support California's economy, transportation (streets,
 bridges, trade corridors, active transportation and transit) and water related needs
 (supply, sewer, storm water, flood control, beach erosion, etc.) including maintenance
 and construction. Support appropriate streamlining of storm water regulations and CEQA
 to avoid duplication and reduce litigation.
- 2. Develop Realistic Responses to the Homeless Crisis. Increase state and federal funding and support to provide additional shelter and services to California's homeless, and advance the recommendations of the CSAC-League Homelessness Task Force.
- 3. Improve the Affordability of Workforce Housing and Secure Additional Funds for Affordable Housing. Increase state and federal financial support, reduce regulatory barriers, and provide additional incentives and local financial tools to address the affordability of workforce housing and increase the availability of affordable housing.
- 4. Address Public Safety Impacts of Reduced Sentencing Laws, Protect Local Priorities in the Implementation of AUMA, and Preserve City Rights to Deliver Emergency Medical Services. Provide tools and resources cities need to respond to recent changes in statewide criminal sentencing policies. Protect local priorities during development of regulations and legislation to implement the Adult Use of Marijuana Act. In addition, continue to preserve city rights to deliver emergency medical services (Health and Safety Code 1797.201).
