OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide an update of Code Enforcement efforts related to Short Term Rentals (STR) complaints.

BACKGROUND


In October 2017, a series of modifications to the Code Enforcement Policies and Procedures were initiated to address a number of STR complaints in the City. The Code Enforcement Unit detailed specific action items related to: community outreach, STR Complaint Form, and proactive code enforcement. Currently, there has been an increase in the calls for service related to STR complaints.

DISCUSSION

Following research of vacation rental websites and staff responding to STR Complaint Form submittals, provided is a general overview and statistics of proactive Code Enforcement cases.

The map below depicts general locations of cited STR properties and pending enforcement cases:



Enforcement of STRs continues to be staff intensive as the Code Enforcement Officers spend an average of 5-12 hours per week conducting online research and verification of STR properties operating within the City boundaries. Recognizing that vacation rental website listings are increasing, additional assessment was conducted to identify possible options for software technology services and/or other innovative tools to automate the process for monitoring and compliance of STR properties, as well as, administration of enforcement actions.

A pilot program will be deployed in January 2019 through Host Compliance, a software tracking system provider that locates existing STRs conducting business within the City limits. Based on a general evaluation provided by Host Compliance, approximately 350 to 400 active short-term rental properties were identified in the City. The pilot program will be administered over a three-month period from January 1, 2019 through March 31, 2019. Implementation of this pilot program would be a fixed-fee amount of \$2,000. This trial period will allow Code Enforcement to determine the effectiveness of automating STR tracking and facilitate enforcement more effectively to address repeat STR violations.

Currently, the Host Compliance software tracking system is utilized in 150 cities and counties nationwide. Within Orange County, Buena Park has had successful results using the software to address STR violations around the amusement park Knott's Berry Farm.

CONCLUSION

In April 2019, an evaluation of the Host Compliance trial period will be conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of the software tracking system. The Code Enforcement Unit will continue to proactively enforce STR violations and will apprise the City Council of future Code Enforcement initiatives.




Fitz Students Engage in Hands-on Learning on College Campus



Garden Grove and Westminster prep basketball squads are honing their games and gearing up for league play.

The marquee teams from each city are headed for a Golden West League-opening showdown on Ian. 4.

At 7:15 p.m. that night, Garden Grove High (9-2 as of earlier this week) is favored against neighboring-city rival Westminster High (5-4 as of earlier this week). The game will be played at Westminster High.

"With our pack we roar. With

our pride we represent. With our hearts we lead," chanted a group of sophomore girls exiting school last week. The girls were asked about their chances against the Argonauts and repeated the Lions' school motto, amid laughter and fist-pumping.

Grove is led by 6-feet-4-inch senior Sebastian Castro, who is averaging 25 points and 7 rebounds a game, and 6-feet-1 junior Jerry Martinez, averaging 14 points and 7 rebounds.

Westminster depends on 6-1 senior Isiah Lee (18 points, 7 rebounds a game) and 6-6 junior Matthew Brookins (12 points, 7

Santiago opens league play against Rancho Alamitos at 7 p.m., Dec. 18 at Santiago.

La Quinta hosts Los Amigos at 7 p.m., Dec. 18.

4 Star ready to offer star treatment

The theater in west Garden Grove to add eight movie screens and 800 recliners

The plain-wrapped 4 Star on the corner of Valley View and Chapman Avenue in Garden Grove represents another era in movie theater history. Scarcely updated since it opened in 1974, the drab little cinema offers just the basics: creaky seats, faded carpet and some pretty tasty popcorn.

But now the neighborhood theater is on its way to joining the 21st century.

By this time next year, if all goes as scheduled, the number of screens will quadruple and cushy recliners will take the place of hard-backed chairs. Popcorn still will be on the menu, of course, but a new kitchen also will offer pizza and sandwiches.

"Customers today are demanding Dolby sound systems and motorized reclining seats," said the property's developer, Daniel Akarakian.

No, the 4 Star will not become the 12 Star, Akarakian said. It will be renamed West Grove Cinema.

The 4 Star joined a chain of five other Starlight Cinemas scattered throughout Southern California when Akarakian bought it in 2016. Earlier this year, he

purchased the remainder of the 2.7-acre property that the 4 Star sits on, including a recently shuttered bowling alley and a vacant restaurant.

Akarakian plans to invest \$12 million in renovating the mall. His blueprint calls for enlarging the cinema by almost 3,000 square feet after demolishing the one-time bowling alley next door. Also, he will add an automated car wash, a Jack in the Box and a sit-down restaurant yet to be determined.

"It's a testament to the property owner's long-term commitment to west Garden Grove," said Lisa Kim, the city's community and economic development director. "This is a great catalyst for more investment in the west side."

The best thing about the 4 Star is its affordable fare. That's not going away, Akarakian promised, even with the fancy accouter-

"Ticket prices will remain the same, with \$5 bargain days on Tuesdays and Thursdays," he said.

Typically, the 4 Star offers first-run family entertainment. Its current lineup includes "The Grinch" and "Creed II."

"Now we will be able to play almost everything that comes out, as well as art films," Akarakian said. "There will be a wider variety of films for the public."

The total number of seats will increase from about 600 to 800. However, each individual theater will hold at least one-third fewer seats, with the smallest accommodating only 45 recliners, Akarakian said

Akarakian said.
"Modernization usually pays off in better attendance, especially for theaters that haven't been renovated for

a while," said Phil Contrino, spokesman for the National Association of Theatre Owners. "Customers enjoy the experience, spurring them to go more often."

And that's important when movie fans have so many choices on Netflix and HBO, Contrino said, "Consumer expectations are higher. If they have a night out, they want to maximize it."

Based on resident surveys, the city requested a full-service, sit-down restaurant as part of the deal.

"Restaurants and theaters make a good marriage," Kim said. "You start with a nice meal, and then you see the latest and greatest movie."

Construction work should begin early in the new year.

Road rage erupts in gunfire and a crash; two people arrested

GARDEN GROVE » A road rage episode Saturday morning led to gunshots and a crash that sent a passenger to the hospital and two men to jail, police say.

At 1:20 a.m., a police officer driving southbound on Harbor Boulevard came across a major collision at the intersection of Harbor Boulevard and Lampson Avenue and discovered that a shooting occurred, said Garden Grove Police Sgt. Erick Leyva.

An investigation showed a red 2007 Ford pickup truck and a white 2014 Hyundai sedan were heading westbound on the 22 Freeway when the occupants got involved in an incident of road rage, Leyva said.

The vehicles left the freeway and drove northbound on Harbor Boulevard. The vehicles were following each other "and at 714-731-5800.

least one occupant of the Ford pickup truck shot at the occupants of the Hyundai sedan," the release said.

The shooter was identified as Pedro Montellana, 22, of Westminster.

The fight ended when the driver of the Hyundai, Juan Batalla-Olmedo, 19, of Santa Ana, purposely struck the pickup truck, according to Leyva.

One passenger was injured during the collision and was transported to the hospital with what were described as non lifethreatening injuries. The weapon in the shooting turned out to be a BB gun, police said.

Montellana and Batalla-Olmedo were arrested on suspicion of assault with a deadly weapon and booked at the Orange County Jail.

Mayor and council members are sworn in

A "new" Garden Grove City Council was seated Tuesday, with three incumbents starting new terms and a fourth member starting a four-year stint.

The mayor serves for two years and council members for four.

(https://orangecountytribune.files.wordpress.com/2016/07/gg-logo_lg-e1446082015536.jpg)Sworn in were incumbents Mayor Steve Jones, Councilmembers Phat Bui (District 4) and Thu-Ha Nguyen (District 3) as well as newcomer George Brietigam, who will serve as the councilman representing District 1, known as West Grove.

The council also said farewell to Kris Beard, the outgoing councilman who served from 2001 to 2018, most recently from District 1.

"It's been the honor of my life to be a councilman and as mayor pro tem for the City of Garden Grove," said Beard, who was presented with several honors including a "Beard" street sign.

Brietigam gave some insight into the might-have-beens of the 2018 council race. "I really didn't even know I was going to be running until three days before the final deadline for filing, " he said. "And I wasted a day waiting for my wife to decide if I could run or not."



Jones said serving as mayor was a "passion" for him. "It's certainly a thrill to be a part of this city at this time that we're going through with all the challenges and so many opportunities," he said.

In 2019, the council will grapple with the issue of trying to hammer out a contract agreement with the Orange County Fire Authority to take over fire and paramedic services for the city, a move that has been controversial.

Additionally, the new council will take on implementation of a 1-cent sales tax approved by voters on Nov. 6 that is expected to being in an additional \$19 million annually to city coffers. The new tax doesn't kick in until April 1.

The next council meeting is set for Jan. 8, 2019.

UPDATE: Stephanie Klopfenstein was selected the new mayor pro tempore.



Alamitos Intermediate gets national honor

Garden Grove Unified School District's Alamitos Intermediate School was named an AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) National Demonstration School last week. Less than 200 schools across the nation and a select few in Orange County earn the designation, which signifies exemplary school-wide implementation of AVID's college readiness systems and strategies.

Alamitos Intermediate is the district's third AVID National Demonstration School, making GGUSD the first and only district in California to have three National Demonstration Schools. Doig Intermediate School and Santiago High

School also hold the distinction, each having passed a "rigorous validation process" so that AVID strategies are implemented at the highest level across all classrooms.

Alamitos Intermediate is only the ninth AVID National Demonstration School in Orange County.

Officials commended Alamitos for being a model campus for the life-changing impact AVID can have for students when implemented at the highest level. Additionally, officials called the supportive environment provided to students and the professional learning support for teachers among the best they have witnesses during their validation visits.



AVID is offered at the district's seven high schools and 10 intermediate schools. This year, GGUSD also launched AVID at several elementary schools.

The GGUSD serves most of Garden Grove and portions of Anaheim, Cypress, Fountain Valley, Santa Ana, Stanton, and Westminster.

HB, GG are ranked among "safest cities"

SURF CITY is also one of the safest cities in California, as is Garden Grove, according to a study released Sunday (WSL photo/Morris).

Garden Grove and Huntington Beach are among the top 15 safest large cities in the state, according to a survey done by Wallethub.com.

The study ranked the top 150 largest cities in the categories of "home and community safety" (including crime), "natural disaster risk" (including danger of earthquakes, forest fires, hurricanes) and "financial safety" (including

unemployment rates, poverty and bankruptcies).

No California cities made the top 10 – earthquake and wild fire danger were big negatives – but Irvine was 30th nationally and first in the Golden State. The next highest-ranked Orange County city was Huntington Beach (eighth in the state and 61st nationally).

"Surf City" was 18th nationally for home and community safety, but 171st for risk of a

natural disaster.

"The Big Strawberry" was 35th for home and community safety, but the natural disaster risk rank was at 170th. Garden Grove was also noticed as one of the five cities nationally with the fewest law enforcement employees per capita.

Also ranked were Anaheim (17th and 99th) and Santa Ana (22nd and 119th).

The "safest" city in the survey was Columbia, Maryland; at the bottom is St. Louis.

NEW FIRE STATION SIX GOES INTO SERVICE

After much anticipation, Garden Grove fire fighters will be responding out of their new fire station number 6 tomorrow, December 13, at 2:00 p.m. The current and aging station 6, located at the corner of Chapman Avenue and Debbie Lane, will go out of service at the same time. The current station provided service to residents and visitors on the east side of the City for 47 years. The new station 6 is a full-function, 7,680 square foot facility that can accommodate up to eight fire fighters daily. The new fire house is located at West Haven Park, 12232 West Street.

Plans for the new station began in 2015 with authorization of a \$5.5 million Certificate of Participation (lease revenue) bond by the Garden Grove City Council, not utilizing the General Fund. In 2016, the City conducted a series of community meetings to determine a new site for the new fire station. The project broke ground on May 23, 2017. "It's an exciting day to open a new fire house, and many members of the City worked collaboratively to bring this opening to fruition," said fire chief, Tom Schultz.

CITY NOW OFFERING FIRST-TIME HOME BUYER PROGRAMS

The City is now offering First-Time Home Buyer Programs for qualifying low-income families. The CalHome loan is a 30-year deferred payment loan requiring no monthly payments, not exceeding \$60,000, which accrues 3-percent simple annual interest for the life of the loan. The loan is designed to assist with covering the difference between a qualifying mortgage amount and the actual price of a single-family home for qualified low- and very low-income families.

The City also offers the Workforce Initiative Subsidy for Homeownership Grant. The matching grant is up to \$15,000 that assists qualifying low- and very low-income families with the down payment or closing costs. For every dollar a resident puts towards the down payment, the City will match with three dollars.

There are openings available for the First Time Home Buyer workshops which introduce potential Garden Grove homeowners to the process of buying a home, how to qualify for a home mortgage, and information regarding financial assistance programs offered through the City. The workshops will take place on January 5, 2019 and February 2, 2019, 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., at the Garden Grove Courtyard Center, located at 12732 Main Street.

Orange County Division Members,

The following is a report on <u>SB 50</u>, a bill authored by Senator Weiner, which has a direct impact on cities' local land use authority. Down below is a description of the bill; a summary report with more detail is attached for your city's review.

Second, here is a recent Los Angeles Times article covering <u>SB 50</u>, which includes a quote from our League Assistant Legislative Director Jason Rhine and highlights the political climate with the Legislature's super-majorities - <u>California Legislator Revives Bill to Boost Apartment Complexes Near Transit</u> (*Los Angeles Times*).

Third, the League does not have a position on <u>SB 50</u> yet; it will be taken to the League's Policy Committees in January for an official position. In the meantime, please send me your city's initial read and thoughts on the bill so that I may communicate them to the Orange County Division's Policy Committee representatives whom will be voting on <u>SB 50</u>.



SB 50 (Wiener) Equitable Communities Incentive

SB 5 (Wiener) is a developer opt-in bill that would require a city, county, or city and county to grant an equitable communities incentive to eligible development proponents. In order to be eligible for an equitable communities incentive, a residential development shall meet all of the following criteria:

- The residential development is either a <u>job-rich housing project</u> or <u>transit-rich housing project</u>.
- The residential development is located on a site that, at the time of application, is zoned to allow housing as an underlying use in the zone, including, but not limited to, a residential, mixed-use, or commercial zone, as defined and allowed by the local government.
- The residential development must comply with a locally adopted inclusionary housing ordinance, if it requires more than 20% for low-income and 11% for very low-income households.
- States that it is the intent of the Legislature to require that any development of ____ or more residential units receiving an equitable communities incentive include housing affordable to low,

very low or extremely low income households, which, for projects with low or very low income units, are no less than the number of onsite units affordable to low or very low income households that would be required pursuant to subdivision (f) of Section 65915 for a development receiving a density bonus of 35 percent (20% for low-income and 11% for very low-income households.)

- The site does not contain, or has not contained, either of the following:
 - Housing occupied by tenants within the seven years preceding the date of the application, including housing that has been demolished or that tenants have vacated prior to the application for a development permit.
 - A parcel or parcels on which an owner of residential real property has exercised his or her rights under the Ellis Act, Chapter 12.75 (commencing with Section 7060) of Division 7 of Title 1 to withdraw accommodations from rent or lease within 15 years prior to the date that the development proponent submits an application.
- The residential development complies with all applicable labor, construction employment, and wage standards otherwise required by law and any other generally applicable requirement regarding the approval of a development project, including, but not limited to, the local government's conditional use or other discretionary permit approval process, the California Environmental Quality Act, or a streamlined approval process that includes labor protections.
- The residential development complies with all other relevant standards, requirements, and prohibitions imposed by the local government regarding architectural design, restrictions on or oversight of demolition, impact fees, and community benefits agreements.
- The equitable communities incentive shall not be used to undermine the economic feasibility of delivering low-income housing under the state density bonus program or a local implementation of the state density bonus program, or any locally adopted program that puts conditions on new development applications on the basis of receiving a zone change or general plan amendment in exchange for benefits such as increased affordable housing, local hire, or payment of prevailing wages.

A residential development that meets the criteria specified above shall receive, upon request, an equitable communities incentive as follows:

- "Job-rich housing project" shall receive the following:
 - A waiver from maximum controls on density.
 - A waiver from maximum automobile parking requirements greater than 0.5 automobile parking spots per unit.
 - Up to three incentives and concessions pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 65915 (Density Bonus law). These incentives or concessions may include, but are not limited to, a height limitation, a setback requirement, a floor area ratio, an onsite open-space requirement, or a parking ratio that applies to a residential development pursuant to any ordinance, general plan element, specific plan, charter, or other local condition, law, policy, resolution, or regulation.
- "Transit-rich housing project" shall receive the following:

A residential development within <u>one-quarter mile radius of a stop on a high-quality bus corridor</u>:

• A waiver from maximum controls on density.

- A waiver from maximum automobile parking requirements greater than 0.5 automobile parking spots per unit.
- Up to three incentives and concessions pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 65915 (Density Bonus law). These incentives or concessions may include, but are not limited to, a height limitation, a setback requirement, a floor area ratio, an onsite open-space requirement, or a parking ratio that applies to a residential development pursuant to any ordinance, general plan element, specific plan, charter, or other local condition, law, policy, resolution, or regulation.

A residential development that is located within a one-half mile radius, but <u>outside a one-quarter mile radius, of a major transit stop</u> and includes no less than _____ percent affordable housing units shall receive an additional incentive as follows:

- o A waiver from maximum controls on density.
- O Up to three incentives and concessions pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 65915 (Density Bonus law). These incentives or concessions may include, but are not limited to, a height limitation, a setback requirement, a floor area ratio, an onsite open-space requirement, or a parking ratio that applies to a residential development pursuant to any ordinance, general plan element, specific plan, charter, or other local condition, law, policy, resolution, or regulation.
- o A waiver from maximum height requirements less than 45 feet.
- o A wavier from maximum FAR requirements less than 2.5.
- o A waiver from maximum automobile parking requirement.

A residential development that is located within a <u>one-quarter mile radius of a major</u> <u>transit stop</u> and includes no less than ____ percent affordable housing units shall receive an additional incentive as followings:

- o A waiver from maximum controls on density.
- Oup to three incentives and concessions pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 65915 (Density Bonus law). These incentives or concessions may include, but are not limited to, a height limitation, a setback requirement, a floor area ratio, an onsite open-space requirement, or a parking ratio that applies to a residential development pursuant to any ordinance, general plan element, specific plan, charter, or other local condition, law, policy, resolution, or regulation.
- o A waiver from maximum height requirements less than 55 feet.
- o A waiver from maximum FAR requirements less than 3.25.
- A waiver from any maximum automobile parking requirement.

Bureau of Cannabis Control Regulations Pending Office of Administrative Law Review

December 10, 2018

The Bureau of Cannabis Control (BCC) issued its finalized cannabis regulations on Friday, Dec. 3, which do not take into account the concerns of cities.

The League <u>submitted written comments</u> to the BCC expressing concerns over the modified proposed regulations after they were issued on Oct. 19. The modified proposed regulations not only prohibit a city from banning cannabis deliveries within their jurisdiction, they also prevent cities from enacting delivery regulations that work best for their local communities.

Next Steps

The BCC sent its finalized regulations to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), which now has 30 days to review and determine if the regulations will be implemented as adopted by BCC. If OAL approves these regulations, statewide deliveries would be allowed in every jurisdiction statewide.

The League will continue to update members as developments are made available.
