Construction News Week of March 30, 2020

Pole Foundation Installation

Crews will start to install foundations for the poles necessary to carry the overhead wiring for the OC Streetcar. Work activities will include excavation, trenching, concrete pours and road work and restoration. Tree trimming and, in some cases, tree removals may be necessary along the streetcar route. Crews will follow all necessary guidelines for monitoring possible bird nesting's with an arborist. Foundation installation work requires temporary parking and lane restrictions.

Water Pipeline and Storm Drain Work


Crews continue to perform water pipeline work and storm drain installation work along the project route, which include excavation, trenching, installation of water pipelines, and road work and restoration. Water pipeline and storm drain installation work requires temporary parking and lane restrictions.

Access will be maintained for all residents and businesses.

SEGMENT 1 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Intersection of Harbor Blvd. and Westminster Ave. to Raitt St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 1 construction activities will include:

- Preliminary work at the site of the future Maintenance Storage Facility
- Ongoing work including excavation and material hauling within Pacific Electric Right-of-Way (PEROW)
- Santa Ana River Bridge construction
- Westminster Avenue Bridge construction
- · Storm drain installation within the PEROW
- · Water pipeline installation and testing at the PEROW on Fairview Street

A full nighttime closure of Westminster Avenue, from Harbor Boulevard to Enterprise Drive, will be in effect 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. on Tuesday, March 31, to accommodate Westminster Avenue Bridge construction.

Water pipeline work will generally move west to east and will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on Fairview Street.

SEGMENT 2 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Raitt St. to Parton St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 2 construction activities will include:

- Foundation installation for the poles that will carry the streetcar overhead wiring on W. Santa Ana Boulevard, from Raitt Street to N. Hesperian Street
- · Asphalt work and restoration on W. Santa Ana Boulevard

Pole foundation installation will require temporary lane closures and parking restrictions on W. Santa Ana Boulevard.

SEGMENT 3 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Ross St. to Mortimer St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 3 construction activities will include:

- Storm drain installation at the intersection of Ross Street and W. Santa Ana Boulevard
- Storm drain installation at the intersection of W. Santa Ana Boulevard and Sycamore Street
- · Asphalt work and restoration on W. Santa Ana Boulevard

Storm drain installation work will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on W. Santa Ana Boulevard, Ross Street and Sycamore Street.

SEGMENT 4 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Ross St. to Mortimer St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 4 construction activities will include:

- Water pipeline installation and testing on 4th Street, from Ross Street to Spurgeon Street
- Asphalt work and restoration on 4th Street
- Limited tree pruning and removal on 4th Street

Crews will be working during the day and night on 4th Street, from Ross Street to Broadway, while some businesses are closed.

Crews will also be working during the day and night on 4th Street, from Main Street Spurgeon Street, for approximately one week. Once the work is complete, crews will move to work between Broadway to Main Street for approximately one week.

With a 24-hour road closure in place for these work locations, the time frame to install water pipelines will be significantly reduced.

SEGMENT 5 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Mortimer St. to SARTC

No construction activities are anticipated in Segment 5 over the next two weeks

Safety of the crews and community is our top priority. Please slow down near work sites and follow pedestrian instructions.

Two-Hour Free Parking

Since December 1, the first two hours of parking are free in parking structures in Downtown Santa Ana.

About the Project

OC Streetcar is the first modern streetcar project to be built in Orange County and will serve Santa Ana's historic and thriving downtown, which includes federal, state and local courthouses, government offices, colleges, an artists' village and a thriving restaurant scene. Expected to begin carrying passengers in 2022, it will operate along a 4.15-mile route that connects the Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center (SARTC) and a new transit hub at Harbor Boulevard and Westminster Avenue in Garden Grove.

Advisory: OC Streetcar Construction During COVID-19 Closures

Dear Nixle User,

Starting Monday, March 30, 2020, while many businesses on 4th Street are closed to the public, Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) will be adding OC Streetcar construction crews during the day and night to replace the water line between Broadway and Mortimer Street. This effort will reduce the time of inconvenience from the OC Streetcar construction significantly. With a 24-hour street closure on 4th Street and crews able to work during the day and night, the construction timeframe will be

substantially shorter.

Construction crews will begin work between Main Street and Spurgeon Street and, once the work is completed after approximately one week, will move to work between Broadway to Main Street for approximately one week. Sidewalks will remain open and access to businesses will maintained at all times.

The general daytime work hours for construction activities will be 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., and the general nighttime w! ork hours for construction activities will be 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. Please note, all scheduled activities are weather permitting and are subject to change.

Governor Newsom has issued a "stay at home" executive order to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. Construction of public transportation projects is considered an essential service and is exempt from this order. Work will continue on the OC Streetcar project as scheduled. Safety is our top priority; construction workers will be following all health and safety quidelines.

Man arrested after shooting inside a house, car set on fire in Orange

A 27-year-old man was arrested after police said he shot at an Orange house with people inside and later set the car in the home's driveway on fire.

On Tuesday night, police were called about 9 p.m. to a home in the 500 block of North Milford

Road, said Orange police Sgt. Phil McMullin.

Callers reported hearing multiple shots fired from a car, and at least one of them hit the house, McMullin said. No one inside the home was hurt.

The suspect fled in a black sedan before police arrived.

The next night, on Wednesday about 7:45 p.m., officers were called to the same residence about a car in the driveway on fire. Or- car but it fled west on Chapman threats, arson, felony evading and ange firefighters responded and extinguished the blaze in the car, which was empty at the time, Mc-Mullin said

Witnesses reported seeing the same black sedan leaving the scene of the burning car. About 15 minutes later, the officers found den Grove. They tried to stop the an inhabited residence, criminal ing held in lieu of \$250,000 bail.

The chase ended when the car hit a center divider on Harbor and Garden Grove boulevards. McMullin said. The driver, Jimmy Salgado of Garden Grove, the suspect's car near Chapman was arrested. He was booked into Avenue and Haster Street in Gar- jail on suspicion of shooting into

weapons charges.

McMullin said Salgado had some dispute with someone in the residence, but police would not give details about it, citing the ongoing investigation. Apart from the shooting and arson, the suspect also had contacted the victim and made threats, police say.



COVID hits GG, WM, Stanton

But numbers are relatively low; OC reports 400-plus cases

The OC Health Care Agency has released date on COVID-19, and Garden Grove and Westminster have eight and twelve cases. Four COVID-related deaths has occurred in the county; county officials have not released the names or cities of residence of the victims.

In all, Orange County has 431 cases. Anaheim has the most reported cases at 41; Newport the least number of cases at one.

Garden Grove, Westminster and Stanton leaders have taken extraordinary steps to prevent the spread of the virus, closing all city facilities and schools, opening emergency operation centers and updating citizens on steps they can take to avoid contracting

the deadly virus.

Garden Grove recently extended closures of City Hall and other city facilities, cancellation of city programs Mayor Steve Jones. and classes, sus-

pension of water shut-offs for non-payment, and the discontinuation of street sweeping parking

"We must be proactive as a community to protect our safety and welfare, and this includes



CITY REMINDS TENANTS, LANDLORDS OF EVICTION **MORATORIUM IN PLACE THROUGH MAY 31**

As a reminder to Garden Grove tenants and landlords, on March 24, 2020, the Garden Grove City Council approved a local emergency resolution that includes a moratorium on rental evictions through May 31, 2020, for tenants who are unable to pay their rent due to causes directly related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

At the Tuesday, March 24 regular City Council meeting, the Garden Grove City Council adopted Resolution 9613-20, ratifying a proclamation of a local emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The resolution further adopted an order establishing a temporary moratorium on residential and commercial evictions and foreclosures in the city through Sunday, May 31, 2020.

The City's moratorium applies when a tenant can document, as a result of COVID-19, the inability to pay rent due to a substantial decrease in household or business income caused by a:

- Layoff, or reduction in compensable hours of work;
- Reduction in open business hours or consumer demand; or
- Substantial out-of-pocket medical expenses

The moratorium does not relieve a tenant of the obligation to pay rent, nor restrict a landlord's ability to recover rent due, and was established pursuant to Governor Gavin Newsom's Executive Order N-28-20 adopted on March 16, 2020.

CITY REMINDS TENANTS, LANDLORDS OF EVICTION MORATORIUM IN PLACE 2-2-2

On March 27, 2020, Governor Newsom issued Executive Order N-37-20 imposing a statewide moratorium suspending residential evictions through May 31, 2020. The statewide moratorium protects residential tenants under specified conditions, including a requirement that the tenant has paid rent prior to March 27, 2020, and the tenant notifies the landlord in writing before rent is due that the tenant needs to delay all or some payment of rent because of three specified conditions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. Governor Newsom's order is intended to build upon his previous executive order granting the City specific authority to halt evictions for renters impacted by the pandemic.

Both actions require tenants to document the need to delay all or some payment of rent and still require tenants to pay their rent if able, or as soon as the moratorium expires on May 31, 2020.

Local residential tenants should follow the directives of Governor Newsom's statewide moratorium. Commercial tenants should communicate with their landlords about the documented impacts of COVID-19 on their business, and work out a payment plan. Neither the statewide moratorium for residential tenants, nor the City's moratorium (which also includes commercial tenants) can protect tenants that fail to pay their rent due to causes not directly related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

League Offers Webinar Series on Adapting City Operations in Response to COVID-19

April 1, 2020

The League of California Cities is conducting a series of webinars to assist city officials with their response to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

Some of the webinar topics include how to conduct meetings while physical distancing, parking requirements, emergency orders and declarations, park closures, issues for employers, and financial support.

COVID-19 Webinar Series: City Parking Requirements

The first in the series of webinars was held March 30, where cities heard about city parking requirements and how to best adapt operations in response to <u>#COVID19</u>. In an effort to mitigate parking impacts to residents caused by COVID-19, cities are providing free alternative off-street parking options and increasing on-street parking meter courtesy times.

During this webinar, participants heard from presenter and City of Sacramento Parking Services Manager Matt Eierman about how cities can suspend parking requirements, how to keep streets safe, and other tips to help alleviate city parking stresses.

Eierman described the tactics that a city with an estimated population of 501,334 has implemented as a result of COVID-19, including some of the measures the city has taken to maintain parking operations while at the same time ease the burden on residents as stay at home orders are in place.

COVID-19 Webinar Series: CARES Act Briefing with the National League of Cities

The second COVID-19 response series, was a joint webinar with the National League of Cities (NLC) on March 31, where cities received a briefing on the new CARES Act. The CARES Act (<u>H.R.</u> 748) is a \$2 trillion Federal relief package intended to provide emergency relief to families, businesses, states, and local governments in response to the COVID-19 crisis.

NLC Senior Executive and Director of Federal Advocacy Irma Esparza Diggs provided webinar participants information on how the CARES Act will fulfill some of the immediate needs of municipal governments to address COVID-19, how governors can use the Coronavirus Relief Fund to allocate resources to local governments, and how cities can access federal funding directly for local budget relief.

Upcoming Webinars

Next week, the League will host two webinars, including loitering prevention in city parks and issuing emergency declarations. Future webinars will be posted on the League's website at www.cacities.org/events and posted on the League's Facebook and twitter pages. Cities Support Businesses, Homeless, Seniors, and Boost Virtual Connections During Coronavirus Pandemic

As many Californians settle into a new physical distancing way of life, cities are working hard to provide their communities with access to resources for care, protection, food, and essential services so that their residents may weather through the COVID-19 pandemic together, while apart.

Local leaders statewide are continuing to step up and address these challenges with creative solutions.

Helping Local Businesses

In an effort to help the local business community, the <u>City of San Marcos</u> City Council approved the City of San Marcos COVID-19 Business Sustainability Program on March 24, 2020. The program includes setting aside up to \$3,000,000 of the city's General Fund Reserves for short-term business loans.

The City of Santa Monica created an inventive way to connect residents with local businesses that are open and providing essential services. The city developed a multilayer interactive map with categories like food, medical care, and childcare into the <u>Santa Monica Essential Business Services Map</u>.

The <u>City of Gustine</u> is helping residents to do their part to stay at home amidst the COVID-19 situation by assisting local businesses with delivery of restaurant orders and pharmacy prescriptions free of charge.

"Our citizens have done an outstanding job so far in honoring the Governor's directive and we want to assist them in doing so as we can," Gustine City Manager Doug Dunford said.

Helping the Homeless

The <u>City of Los Angeles</u> opened five additional emergency shelters at Los Angeles recreation centers for homeless residents, with 500 camper trailers on their way from the state, to help bring people indoors. According to the CDC, an outbreak of COVID-19 in your community could cause illness among people experiencing homelessness, contribute to an increase in emergency shelter usage, and lead to illness and absenteeism among homeless service provider staff. Opening additional emergency shelters and supplying isolated camper trailers will help follow community planning guidelines set forth by the CDC, as a way to protect people experiencing homelessness,

homeless service provider staff, and volunteers from this disease.

The <u>City of Culver City</u> is working with Los Angeles County, local businesses, and the Culver City Police Department's Mental Health Evaluation Team (MHET) to reach out to people currently experiencing homelessness. City staff provide important information about nearby shelters, pass out hand sanitizers, and installed three hand washing stations at the city's largest encampment.

Senior Resources

In the last two weeks, the City of Culver City boosted services for its seniors. Culver City Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department, through the Senior Nutrition Program and Social Services, converted their on-site meal programs to pick-up and delivery service without impacting the seniors. The meal program has increased the number of meal delivery routes by 400 percent, providing more than 1,500 meals so far, and transferred from the lunch room to the front porch. Volunteers wear protective gloves, adhere to social distancing guidelines, and deliver every meal with a smile.

The <u>City of Diamond Bar</u> has activated a new phone line to provide Diamond Bar seniors with recorded information about available resources during this COVID-19 crisis. This resource line addresses the concerns most often raised by community members age 60 and older who have called Diamond Bar City Hall during the past couple of weeks. The inquiries include where to obtain meals and how to secure transportation for medical appointments and grocery shopping. The recording is available every day at any time and the information is updated as details become available.

Community Involvement

The <u>City of Monrovia</u> has developed a new webpage called Monrovia Strong, to give residents access to professional development resources, virtual workouts and guided meditation, online story time, and other connections to stay positive.

The city of Mountain View publishes an electronic update three times a week called *The Briefing* to keep residents informed of the latest news surrounding COVID-19. <u>Mountain View</u> developed a list of how the city has responded over the last 14 days to address the COVID-19 response efforts. Additionally, the city created a fun way to stay positive and engage with neighbors from a distance by inviting residents to join in a <u>Neighborhood Scavenger Hunt</u>, by creating works of art in the daily theme and posting it in their windows for neighbors to see.

Tony Elliot, <u>City of Santa Cruz Parks & Recreation</u> Director, shared a message on ways to help keep families and the community safe by adhering to the shelter-in-place order, physical distancing guidance, and all posted department notices. Elliot shows how families at home can balance work with play, and emphasized the importance of prioritizing self-care through exercise and fresh air

nearby your home – rather than driving to public parks and beaches – to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Several organizations are coordinating food services to community members throughout San Diego County. A large drive thru event, highlighted in a video tweet by San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer on March 28, was sponsored by the Jacobs & Cushman San Diego Food Bank and the San Diego and Imperial Counties Labor Council. The food distribution event allowed for up 1,000 cars to pass through and pick up enough food for 25 meals. People lined up hours before the 9 a.m. start to enter the parking lot of the San Diego County Credit Union Stadium, which shows the arising needs for these services as the coronavirus pandemic continues. The San Diego Food Bank will host a similar event next week at Del Mar Fairgrounds (north county), and a week after that at Grossmont Center (east county).

New Resource Map for Cities

Did you know 9 out of 10 California cities have declared a state of emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic? Check out the League's new <u>interactive map</u> that takes you straight into the city's declaration.

Cities declaring a state of emergency shouldn't be considered a higher risk for contracting the novel virus than cities that do not declare emergencies. The declarations are intended to give cities and towns the ability to free up funds to prepare for or respond to a disaster or an outbreak.

As cities work to provide resources and information for their residents, the League continues to update the <u>coronavirus resource</u> and <u>response webpage</u> as a resource for city staff. Daily updates on COVID-19 news, resources, and guidance specifically geared toward local leaders will help local governments navigate the current situation and is updated as new developments occur.
