ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND UPDATES

OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this memorandum is to report on the 2018-2019 First-Time Home Buyer Program (FTHB) accomplishments and to provide the City Manager with an update on changes for the upcoming program year.

FTHB PROGRAM ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The City of Garden Grove entered into an agreement with Pacific Mercantile Bank on November 14, 2018 to utilize their Workforce Initiative Subsidy for Homeownership (WISH) grant funds for eligible low-income first-time home buyers looking to purchase in the City of Garden Grove. The WISH Grant matches every \$1 the home buyer puts towards a down-payment with \$3, up to a maximum grant amount of \$15,000. The WISH funds were combined with the City's CalHOME funds, which allow the City to repurpose funds that were received from past CalHOME loan payoffs, and allow the City to redeploy the CalHOME funds for new first-time home buyer loans. The CalHOME funds provide up to \$60,000 of assistance to cover the difference between the amount of primary financing the home buyer is approved for and the actual cost of the home.

Extensive community outreach was conducted to promote the City's FTHB Program through an interactive FTHB webpage, press releases, and social media outlets. The webpage provided a streamlined approach for individuals to pre-register for the FTHB workshops. To date, four (4) FTHB Workshops have been held at the Courtyard Center with approximately two hundred people in attendance. These workshops have successfully introduced the City's program to prospective home buyers and has educated first-time home buyers on the home purchasing process and homeownership.

The Neighborhood Improvement Division has successfully funded and assisted three (3) families with Garden Grove home purchases through the issuance two WISH grants totaling \$30,000 and three CalHOME loans totaling \$179,480. In addition, there are numerous families and individuals pre-approved for the program funds that are currently searching for homes to purchase in Garden Grove.

2019-2020 PROGRAM UPDATE

Given the FTHB Program accomplishments, the City has been awarded \$88,000 of WISH funds by Pacific Mercantile Bank for the 2019-2020 program year resulting in an increased amount of WISH grants towards the down-payment assistance. A significant change in the 2019-2020 grant funds provides for the WISH Program to increase a \$4 to \$1 match and up to \$22,000 of down-payment assistance. This increase in the match amount will allow a larger population of home buyers to purchase in Garden Grove and will assist low-income families combat the elevated home prices seen around the city.

There are four (4) FTHB Workshops scheduled for the new program year. The 2019-2020 workshop dates are:

- August 10, 2019
- October 5, 2019
- January 18, 2020
- February 22, 2020

There are approximately 100 people registered for the upcoming workshops for 2019-2020. Outreach will continue via press releases and social media posts in the coming months about the upcoming FTHB workshops. Information about the FTHB Program is also available through the City of Garden Grove website at ggcity.org/neighborhood-improvement/first-time-home-buyer-programs.

Enclosed is the April 2019 Investment Report which shows the financial institutions, types of investment instruments, monthly transactions, current month interest received, and the par and fair market value of investments held. The month-end cash in the bank and petty cash balances are also listed on the Cash and Investment Report. The pie chart (please see chart on attachment A) reflects the investment instruments as a percentage of the total portfolio.

This investment portfolio meets State guidelines and adheres to the City's investment policy. As of April 2019, the City's total portfolio is invested in:

The cash with fiscal agents is restricted as they are funds held and invested by an outside fiscal agent. The restrictions were set forth in the related bond indentures. As of April 2019, 5.859% of the portfolio is restricted.

In summary, the investment portfolio is secured and the City has the necessary cash to pay its bills for six months in a timely manner. Please call me at extension #5060 if you have any questions.



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

Mental health hearing in carjack case

A mental health pre-trial review will be held on Friday, June 7 in the case of a man who allegedly grabbed a rifle from inside a Garden Grove police car and fired a round though the window on Feb. 13, 2018.

Stephen Eric Matthews – formerly of New York City but now considered a Garden Grove resident – was being charged with five felonies and one misdemeanor.

According to the Orange County District Attorney's office, Matthews was charged with one count each of:

- assault with a firearm on a peace officer
- · shooting from a motor vehicle
- · discharging a firearm with gross negligence
- unlawful possession of a loaded firearm in public vandalism over \$400.

Also, he is facing one misdemeanor charge of resisting a police officer.

Matthews was at a drug and alcohol treatment center in Garden Grove when police were called to assist. Center staff decided to transfer Matthews to another facility, and he was placed in the back compartment of a police patrol car.

There he was able to get through what police say was a defective Plexiglas barrier, remove the rifle from its lock and fire one round through the front windshield. He also allegedly used the butt of the rifle to smash the in-car computer.

After a three-hour standoff, he finally surrendered to police early the next morning. No one was injured and police did not fire their weapons.

The hearing is set for 9 a.m. in the West Justice Center in Westminster.

Placentia may opt to break away from OCFA

Frustrated by rising bills from the Orange County Fire Authority, Placentia is poised to consider creating its own fire department and contracting with a private ambulance company for emergency medical services.

The Placentia City Council will discuss the idea Tuesday. The proposal comes after detailed research and recommendations from a panel of experts, City Administrator Damien Arrula said Friday.

I would be a momentous change for Placentia after more than two decades of contracting with the fire authority, but Arrula said that whatever the council decides, the goal is to provide residents with top-quality emergency services while

keeping costs manageable.

"We value and appreciate OCFA as a partner and will continue to do so regardless of the decision that's being made on Tuesday night," he said, adding, "At the end of the day, we need to do what we believe is best for our community."

Fire authority spokeswrote in an email Saturday that OCFA officials would be disappointed to see Placentia leave because "the services provided in and out of the city are part of a larger system that affords continuity of excellent fire and EMS care."

She added that the city has not sought to renegotiate the terms of its contract.

The fire authority serves 23 cities in Orange County. with Garden Grove set to join this summer.

fire service cost increases that far outpaced the rest of the city budget, Placentia officials gave the authority the required year's notice that the city might withdraw from the contract.

In the decade since 2009, Arrula said, the city saw its bills from OCFA go up nearly 47% for the same service and woman Colleen Windsor the general fund budget overall rose less than 10% and the cost for the city's police department decreased.

His report to the council notes that, based on data for fiscal 2018, nearly 80% of the calls OCFA handled that year were for medical issues rather than fires, a trend many departments have seen as building code updates and other advancements have decreased the incidence of fires in developed areas.

with firefighter/paramedics is the first vehicle dispatched with lights and sirens to all calls, the report said.

Windsor said costs for all members of the authority have gone up because of contract changes they agreed to, and because of pension expenses, which have been a concern for nearly every public agency in the state.

Also, Windsor said, two years ago the authority increased service to Placentia by adding three firefighter/paramedics at one of the city's stations. For every dollar OCFA spends on service to the city, Placentia pays back only 57.5 cents, she said.

Arrula's analysis found that forming a new department to focus on fire protection, hazmat and rescue services, and hiring Lynch Ambulance for emergency medical and transport ser- personnel, who could move placentia.org.

vices, would carry one-time startup costs projected at \$1.5 million. Once established, a typical year of operations would run about \$5.7 million, versus the annual \$7.4 million the OCFA contract would cost, Arrula

Lynch was the only bidder on the emergency medical services side. Anaheim Fire and Rescue and the Fullerton/Brea Fire Department made proposals for the fire protection side; in a letter. OCFA declined to submit a bid. Arrula's report said.

The city owns the two fire stations within its boundaries that OCFA operates from now, but would have to purchase equipment and hire

onto the career track as positions open up, Arrrula said.

Because Placentia operates its own Police Department, it already has 911 dispatchers, so they could handle fire and medical calls rather than transferring them to the fire authority.

If the council chooses the route of a city department, it could take nine months to a year to establish.

Based on the city's research, Arrula said, the proposal is expected to help reduce costs and response times while also providing more local control over fire and emergency services.

The City Council will meet at 7 p.m. Tuesday in the council chambers at Placentia City Hall, 401 E. Chapman Ave.

Debate over gay pride flag ends in deadlock

City Council divided on Councilwoman Kim Nguyen proposal

Barring an extraordinary event, there will not be a gay pride flag displayed at Garden Grove City Hall this month, which is Gay Pride Month.

The City Council did not come to a consensus on the issue at a contentious May 28 City Council meeting, which effectively ends

About 30 speakers aired their views. The majority supported flying a rainbow or gay pride flag during the month of June.

the issue.

"I'm here to voice support for flying the pride and rainbow flag," said resident Bob Tucker.

Tucker cited an oft-used Muslim quote to drive home his point: "A lot of different flowers make up a bouquet."
Councilwoman Kim Nguyen has brought the proposal to the City Council, sparking a city-wide debate

Council members John O'Neill, Phat Bui and George Brietigam, who all supported a proclamation recognizing June as Gay Pride Month, did not support flying a flag.

O'Neill said the city has a policy in place, and he chooses to follow it.

"We do have a flag policy and our flag policy for the last 60 years is we only fly governmental flags."

Brietigam criticized some supporters of the gay pride flag.

"We have various folks come here and if you have a difference of opinion... you become homophobic, racist, uncompassionate," he said. "We can't just have a logical difference of opinional in offended by that."

Locals in favor of flying the flag said doing so would send a message that Garden Grove supports LGBTQ+ people who have long been marginalized.

"It's important to recognize people for who they are," said Ethan Wynn.

Chuck Jones implored the city to display the flag, saying it's not only the right thing to do socially, but it's the right thing to do economically, and he concluded with this:

"Homosexuality exists in over 450 species. Homophobia exists in one. So, what are you afraid of?"

Councilwoman Kim Nguyen, Mayor Steve Jones and Councilwoman Thu-Ha Nguyen have supported flying the flag. Councilwoman Stephanie Klopfenstein was absent because of illness during the May 14.3-3 vote on the issue. There was no vote at the May 28 meeting, but Klopfenstein seconded Councilwoman Nguyen's motion to take a second look at the city's flag policy.

A handful of locals urged the council to vote no on flying the flag.

"I believe we already have a flag that represents every American," said James Webb.

Webb said if the gay pride flag is allowed to be displayed at City Hall, it will open the door for other nongovernmental groups to demand that their flags be flown.

"Why not the Rebel flag?" he asked. "The Jewish flag? The Christian flag?"

One resident offered a compromise: Post all proclamations—including the proclamation recognizing Gay Pride Month—in the City Hall lobby.

Mai Nguyen and several others said LGBTQ youth are looking for affirmation; many are in despair and have attempted suicide because they are ashamed or feel unaccepted in their communities.

"This flag not only represents the LGBTQ community, it represents our story," Nguyen said. "I'm asking you to send a message to our youth."

At the end of the discussion, the council agreed to consider a new policy allowing commemorative flags to be displayed at City Hall. That meeting will take place June

The California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) recently released the Draft <u>2019 – 20 Annual Action Plan (AP)</u> and applicable appendices for public comment.

The League of California Cities encourages cities to submit comments on the Draft 2019 – 20 AP During the 30-day public comment period from May 28 through June 26 at 5 p.m.

This is the fifth AP update to the state's <u>2015 – 20 Consolidated Plan</u>. California's Consolidated Plan is a five-year plan that examines the housing and community development needs of Californians and their communities and lays out how federal funds will be used to address these needs and improve the quality of life for Californians.

The Draft 2019 - 20 AP addresses the administration of the estimated 2019 federal funds under the:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program;
- Home Investment Partnerships (HOME) program;
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) program;
- National Housing Trust Fund (NHTF) program; and
- Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) program.
