The City of Garden Grove is an administrative authority for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) allocations.

\$1,245,000 IN CDBG funding was used to benefit low/moderate income residents, through housing rehabilitation, senior services, fair housing activities, infrastructure improvements, and gang suppression activities. The City LEVERAGED \$2,616,000 in non-federal funds at a ratio of 2:1

\$180,000 IN ESG funding was used to provide homeless services through street outreach, emergency shelter, homeless prevention, and rapid rehousing. The City LEVERAGED \$173,000 in non-federal sources at a ratio of 1:1




\$1.2M IN HOME funding was used to develop the Sycamore Court Apartments, a 78-unit of affordable housing community for very low-income households. Developer contributed \$22M in non-City funds to deliver the project.



Fraser became angry when his ex-girlfriend told him she had to leave, and said he wanted the two of them to get back together, according to the trial brief. When her aunt and Toro arrived to pick her up, Fraser followed his ex-girlfriend out to their car, and urged Toro to get out of the vehicle and come into the backyard to fight, prosecutors wrote.

The ex-girlfriend was Fraser, then exited the ve-

and resolves as follows:

WHEREAS, the City of Garden Grove ("City") owns the fee interest in the public right of way known as Brady Way, a public street commencing on Stanford Avenue to the north and terminating in a cul-de-sac at the 22

on Stanford Avenue to the north and terminating in a cul-de-sac at the 22 Freeway to the south;

WHEREAS, Brady Way south of Stanford Avenue was formerly part of Knott Street and is now a cul-de-sac created after CalTrans relocated Knott Street when it widened the 22 Freeway in 1966;

WHEREAS, the southern portion of said street adjacent to the property located at 12821 Knott Street is only used for street parking and access to 12821 Knott Street;

WHEREAS, this street area decayled in the latest the street parking and access to 12821 Knott Street;

WHEREAS, this street area, described in the legal description in Attachment "A" and depicted in Attachment "B" hereto, is no longer necessary for current or prospective public street purposes, or as a non-motorized

transportation facility;

transportation facility;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 3 of Part 3 of Division 9 of the Streets and Highways Code, Sections 8320 et seq., the City Council is authorized on its own initiative to initiate proceedings for vacation of public streets that are no longer necessary for current or prospective public street purposes or as a non-motorized transportation facility;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Streets and Highways Code Section 8312, the City Council is authorized to vacate all or a portion of a public street within the City: and

the City Council is authorized to vacate all or a portion of a public street within the City; and
WHEREAS, on August 15, 2019, the Planning Commission of the City of Garden Grove pursuant to Government Code 65402 found that the proposed vacation of the southerly portion of Brady Way is consistent with the General Plan of the City of Garden Grove.
NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are incorporated by reference herein.

SECTION 2. It is the intention of the City Council to vacate and abandon the southerly portion of Brady Way, south of Stanford Avenue, adjacent to 12821 Knott Street, as more particularly described on Exhibit "A" and depicted on Exhibit "B", attached hereto and incorporated berein by reference. herein by reference

SECTION 3. It is the intention of the City Council to find that the southerly portion of Brady Way adjacent to 12821 Knott Street and described in Attachments "A" and "B" hereto is unnecessary for present or prospective public street purposes, or as a non-motorized transportation

SECTION 4. It is the intention of the City Council to reserve easements for existing public utilities per Section 8340 of the Streets and Highways Code.



Understanding the Nuances of this Session's Use-of-Force Legislation SB 230 and AB 392 Take a Comprehensive Approach in Addressing Peace Officers Use-of-Force

A two-year long debate over police use-of-force in the California Legislature has reached a conclusion. Introduced as competing measures, <u>AB 392</u> (Weber) and <u>SB 230</u> (Caballero), initially took differing approaches toward addressing police use-of-force.

Shortly after the introduction of both bills, the League issued formal support for <u>SB 230</u> and formal opposition for <u>AB 392</u>, the far more controversial of the two bills.

In May, supporters and opponents reached an agreement on the provisions of <u>AB 392</u> through a series of amendments, thereby allowing the overwhelming majority of law enforcement entities and the League to collectively remove their opposition of the bill.

<u>SB 230</u> was made contingent upon the enactment of <u>AB 392</u>, meaning that the provisions of <u>SB 230</u> can only take effect if <u>AB 392</u> is also signed into law. <u>AB 392</u> was signed into law by Governor Gavin Newsom and chaptered on August 19.

Meanwhile, <u>SB 230</u> has passed through its respective policy and fiscal committees with zero 'No' votes, and is currently awaiting an Assembly floor vote. Below, is a breakdown of each bill:

SB 230 (Caballero) Law Enforcement: Use of Deadly Force: Training: Policies

SB 230 is co-sponsored by the California Police Chiefs Association and is supported by virtually all law enforcement agencies throughout the state. Specifically, the bill:

- > Establishes guidelines for use-of-force training by every California law enforcement agency to standardize this type of training throughout the state;
- > Requires every law enforcement agency, by Jan. 1, 2021, to maintain an internal policy that includes specified guidelines on use of force; and
- > Requires each law enforcement agency to make its use-of-force policy accessible to the public.

AB 392 (Weber) Peace Officers: Deadly Force

AB 392 sought to revise the legal standard on law enforcement's use of deadly force by redefining the circumstances under which homicide by a peace officer is deemed justifiable.

Early iterations of AB 392 changed "necessarily committed" or reasonableness, to an unprecedented standard whereby officers may engage in such force only if "necessary," and when there is "no reasonable alternative."

After significant amendments, virtually all opposing law enforcement removed their opposition, taking a neutral position on the measure. These amendments entailed:

- Removing the definition of the term "necessary" as listed in the bill, while retaining the actual term in the findings and declarations section;
- > Removing the language that explicitly required officers to exhaust nonlethal alternatives before resorting to deadly force; and
- > Removing a component that would have allowed officers to be held criminally liable for negligence-related deaths.
