PUBLIC HEARING - FISCAL YEAR 2009-10 MAIN STREET ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 1 (F: 31.4) (XR: 24.1)

Staff report dated June 23, 2009, was introduced and reviewed by staff.

Mayor Dalton declared the Public Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to address the City Council on the matter.

There being no response from the audience, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

RESOLUTION NO. 8910-09

It was moved by Council Member Broadwater, seconded by Council Member Do, and carried by unanimous vote that full reading of Resolution No. 8910-09 be waived, and said Resolution entitled A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE MAKING DETERMINATIONS AND CONFIRMING THE DIAGRAM AND ASSESSMENTS IN THE MATTER OF MAIN STREET ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 1, be and hereby is adopted; and the City Clerk is directed to file and record the assessments with the County Auditor.

PUBLIC HEARING - AMENDMENT AND UPDATE OF THE CITY'S WATER CONSERVATION ORDINANCE AND PLAN (F: 112.7) (XR: 50.2)

Staff report dated June 23, 2009, was introduced and reviewed by staff.

The eight permanent water conservation measures are the key elements of the amended Water Conservation Ordinance. More restrictive water conservation measures could be applied in the event a more severe stage of water conservation is implemented.

This Ordinance has four stages of response to escalating water shortages. Stage 1, Voluntary Conservation-Water Watch; Stage 2, Mandatory Conservation-Water Alert; Stage 3, Mandatory Conservation-Water Warning; and Stage 4, Mandatory Conservation-Water Emergency. At this time, Stage 1, Voluntary Conservation-Water Watch is recommended.

Mayor Dalton declared the Public Hearing open and asked if anyone wished to address the City Council on the matter.

Bob Owens, Charles Mitchell, and David Lautherboren commented on the need for conservation and the effect on water rates. Desalinization plants were suggested as an alternative resource for water.

There being no further response from the audience, the Public Hearing was declared closed.

Council Member Nguyen's expressed concerns of the health and safety of residents as it relates to the restrictions listed in the Ordinance pertaining to run-off. For example, she washes down her driveway to remove bird droppings that pose a health risk to her children. Staff indicated that a certain amount of run-off is expected. The Ordinance addresses excessive run-off.

ORDINANCE NO. 2751 was introduced for first reading and the title read in full, entitled AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE AMENDING CHAPTER 40 OF TITLE 14 OF THE GARDEN GROVE MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO WATER CONSERVATION PROGRAM

It was moved by Council Member Nguyen, seconded by Council Member Broadwater, and carried by unanimous vote that full reading of all Ordinances listed for consideration of adoption be waived.

It was moved by Council Member Do, seconded by Council Member Jones, and carried by unanimous vote that Ordinance No. 2751 be and hereby is passed to second reading.

It was moved by Council Member Do, seconded by Mayor Dalton, and carried by unanimous vote that Ordinance No. 2750 be and hereby is declared adopted.

MATTERS FROM THE MAYOR, CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS, AND CITY MANAGER

Council Member Broadwater announced the memorial services for Sheldon Singer scheduled for Saturday, June 27, at 2 p.m. at Kiwanisland. He commented on the many ways Mr. Singer served the Garden Grove community. (F: 53.1)

Council Member Nguyen also commented on Mr. Singer's service to the community. She encouraged residents to continue to buy in Garden Grove, commenting that the number of foreclosed homes in Garden Grove has dropped substantially. She spoke to the comments Mr. Owens made regarding the Vietnamese War, stating the men and women who lost their lives died with dignity and brought a spirit of freedom to the South Vietnamese people. (F: 53.1)

Council Member Jones offered his condolences to the Singer family, noting Mr. Singer was a very good friend of his father's. (F: 53.1)

Council Member Do also commented on Mr. Owens' remarks regarding the Vietnamese War. Although South Vietnam and the United States did not win the war, had the United States not become involved, the whole Southeast Asia could have fallen into communist hands that would have affected peace in the United States. Those efforts brought freedom to the South Vietnamese people. Council Member Do also thanked the Public Works Department for the groundbreaking ceremony for the street overlay on Gilbert Street, expressing Supervisor Nguyen's appreciation on the recognition of her efforts on behalf of Garden Grove. (F: 53.1) (XR: 24.1)

Mayor Dalton also attended the groundbreaking and expressed his appreciation to Supervisor Nguyen for her efforts.
