RESOLUTION REQUESTING RIGHT-OF-WAY FUNDING DISBURSEMENT BY

OCTA.

### **OBJECTIVE**

To adopt the resolution requesting the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) to disburse the right-of-way funds to the City of Garden Grove for the improvement of Harbor Boulevard from Warner to SR 91, specifically the widening of Harbor Boulevard at Trask Avenue.

### BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

OCTA through the Combined Transportation Funding Programs (CTFP), allocated \$154,837 for right-of-way costs for the improvement of Harbor Boulevard from Warner to SR91. The Harbor/Trask intersection improvement project will widen the west side of Harbor Boulevard to its "Smart Street" designation at its intersection with Trask Avenue, and therefore qualifies for the use of this right-of-way funding. The City will need to adopt the attached resolution for disbursement of 90% of eligible right-of-way costs to the City of Garden Grove. The remaining 10% will be transferred to the City when right-of-way acquisition is completed.

## FINANCIAL IMPACT

The proposed action has no impact on the General Fund. Funding for this project has been made available through Measure "M" funds.

### COMMUNITY VISION IMPLEMENTATION

This project is consistent with the community vision for improving the transportation system to ensure the safe and efficient flow of traffic.



## RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE REQUESTING THE ORANGE COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY TO ALLOCATE COMBINED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM FUNDS FOR HARBOR BLVD.-FROM WARNER TO SR91 IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Orange County Transportation authority approved a Combined Transportation Funding Program (CTFP) for fiscal year 2003-04; and

WHEREAS, the program includes \$154,837 in fiscal year 2003-04 for right-of-way for the Harbor Blvd.-from Warner to SR 91 improvement project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Garden Grove has adopted a General Plan Circulation Element which does not preclude implementation of the MPAH within its jurisdiction;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Garden Grove hereby requests the Orange County Transportation Authority to allocate \$154,837 of CTFP funds from the Growth Management Area (GMA) right-of-way acquisition of said project to the City. This request is in conformance with the CTFP allocation process and does not exceed ninety (90) percent of the programmed amount or ninety (90) percent of the right-of-way costs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Garden Grove agrees to fund its share of the improvement costs of the above-indicated fiscal year and any additional costs over the identified programmed amount.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Garden Grove has made written offer to the property owners for the project on December 14, 2004.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Garden Grove will: 1) design the project improvements, and 2) complete required preparatory work in accordance with the standards required by the City and other affected jurisdictions involved with said project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the remaining ten (10) percent in CTFP funds will be transferred to the City of Garden Grove when right-of-way acquisition is completed and the Orange County Transportation Authority accepts a Final Report on the acquisition. The City of Garden Grove agrees to submit the final report to the Orange County Transportation Authority within one hundred twenty (120) days after the City's certification of the right-of-way.
