AT SR 22 EAST BOUND ON-RAMP INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM - RECOMMENDATION TO ADOPT OCTA FUNDING RESOLUTION

OBJECTIVE

To adopt a resolution requesting the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) to disburse the right-of-way acquisition funds to the City of Garden Grove for the addition of a right turn lane to northbound Euclid Street at SR 22 east bound on-ramp.

BACKGROUND

In fiscal year 2002/03, the City of Garden Grove secured right-of-way acquisition funding of \$50,000 for subject project from OCTA through the Combined Transportation Funding Program (CTFP) via Growth Management Area (GMA). In order to receive reimbursement of the first portion (90%) of that funding, the City will need to adopt the attached resolution.

DISCUSSION

The project will widen the east side of Euclid Street at SR 22 east bound on-ramp to its ultimate width. The work included acquisition of additional right-of-way for street and highway purposes. The project will significantly decrease traffic congestion and improve traffic circulation on northbound Euclid Street.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Funding for this project has been made available through Measure "M" Regional.

COMMUNITY VISION IMPLEMENTATION

This project is consistent with the community vision for maintaining and enhancing the transportation system to ensure the safe and efficient flow of traffic.

RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE REQUESTING THE ORANGE COUNTY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY TO ALLOCATE COMBINED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM FUNDS FOR EUCLID STREET AT SR 22 EAST BOUND ON-RAMP IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Orange County Transportation Authority approved a Combined Transportation Funding Program (CTFP) for fiscal year 2002-03; and

WHEREAS, the program includes \$50,000 in fiscal year 2002-03 for the right-of-way acquisitions in north bound Euclid Street at SR 22 east bound on-ramp; and

WHEREAS, the City of Garden Grove has adopted a General Plan Circulation Element which does not preclude implementation of the MPAH within its jurisdiction; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Garden Grove hereby requests the Orange County Transportation Authority to allocate \$45,000 of CTFP funds from the growth management area for right-of-way acquisitions of said project to the City. This request is in conformance with the CTFP allocation process and does not exceed ninety (90) percent of the programmed amount or ninety (90) percent of the construction costs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Garden Grove agrees to fund its share of the improvement costs of the above-indicated fiscal year and any additional costs over the identified programmed amount.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Garden Grove has initiated the right-of way acquisitions for the project on November 1, 2004.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Garden Grove has: 1) processed the Notice of Offer to Purchase easement for street purposes, and 2) completed required preparatory work in accordance with the standards required by the City and other affected jurisdictions involved with said project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the remaining ten (10) percent in CTFP funds will be transferred to the City of Garden Grove when right-of-way acquisition is completed and the Orange County Transportation Authority accepts a Final Report on the project. The City of Garden Grove agrees to submit the final report to the Orange County Transportation Authority after the City's acceptance of the improvements.
