We will celebrate the 23<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the inauguration by August F. Hawkins, Congressman of the 29<sup>th</sup> District on October 28, 1987. Since its conception, citizens from across the nation have been encouraged to celebrate this day by their respective elected officials who have proclaimed October 28<sup>th</sup> to be National Immigrant's Day as a Public law 100-62 (S. J. Res 86) June 29, 1987.

The celebration will take place inside the Freedom Shrine, which displays with pride a large and complete collection of letters and photographs received over the years from public officials from across the country praising National Immigrant's Day.

We as a community have gathered every October 28<sup>th</sup> since 1988 to commemorate all immigrants who have made significant contributions to our country, and would be honored for you to attend to help us celebrate.


