OBJECTIVE

For City Council to proclaim Friday, April 29, 2011, as Arbor Day in the City of Garden Grove.

BACKGROUND

The City of Garden Grove has a tradition to join various community volunteer groups in tree planting events on Arbor Day or during Arbor Week. The City's Public Works Department utilizes Arbor Day to educate and inform residents about the benefits of trees and to encourage tree planting and stewardship. For the past 17 years Garden Grove has earned the status of a "Tree City USA" from the National Arbor Day Foundation for its efficient tree management program. An Arbor Day observance and Proclamation are requirements that must be met to receive the annual "Tree City USA" recertification.

DISCUSSION



- It is recommended that City Council proclaim Friday, April 29, 2011 as Arbor Day in the City of Garden Grove.



Whereas, In 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set for the planting of trees, and
 Whereas, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska, and Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world, and
 Whereas, trees reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling cost, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife, and
 Whereas, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products, and
 Whereas, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and
 Whereas, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal, and
 Whereas, Garden Grove has been recognized as a Tree City USA by The National Arbor Day Foundation and desires to continue its tree planting practice
