THE TIME WARNER CABLE TELEVISION

(CATV) FRANCHISE AGREEMENT

OBJECTIVE

To recommend that the City Council terminate the City's CATV franchise with Time Warner Cable, and require Time Warner Cable to operate as a state franchisee pursuant to California's Digital Infrastructure and Video Competition Act (DIVCA).

BACKGROUND

In 2002, The City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2577 renewing the City's CATV Franchise with KBL Cable Systems of the Southwest, Inc., doing business as Time Warner Cable (Time Warner) for a period of 20 years. Provisions included franchise payments to the City of 5% of gross annual revenues billed directly to cable subscribers within city limits. As part of the franchise, Time Warner is required to pay monthly Public, Education and Governmental ("PEG") support fees in the amount of 50 cents (\$0.50) per subscriber. After the first 10 years of the franchise term, the fee would decrease in five-cent increments each year thereafter. This process begins in July 2012.

PEG support also includes use of Time Warner's studio and channel playback facilities at 7441 Chapman Avenue, Garden Grove. These provisions help fund and operate cable television access and programming on topics of interest to the local community. This includes televised City Council/Successor Agency coverage. The City's Cable TV Division is the designated Community Access Center managing and operating PEG Channel 3.

On January 1, 2007, the Digital Infrastructure and Video Competition Act of 2006 ("DIVCA") went into effect, taking away cable television franchise authority from local municipalities and giving it exclusively to the California Public Utilities Commission. The stated purpose of this legislation was to enable greater competition in the cable television market by allowing local companies to expand their services to provide video programming. Currently, both AT&T and Verizon have expanded their telephone services to operate CATV Franchises in the City.

In August 2008, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 2731 amending Chapter 25 of Title 5 of the Garden Grove Municipal Code implementing DIVCA. DIVCA requires

state franchisees to pay a franchise fee of 5% of its gross receipts and a local jurisdiction may also require the payment of PEG support fees of 1% of gross receipts. Pursuant to DIVCA, Section 5.25.060 establishes "a fee that is equal to one percent (1%) of the gross revenues of the state video franchise holder generated within City's jurisdictional boundaries, which fee will be used to support PEG channel facilities." The revenue generated under the state franchise is higher than the amount provided by the original franchise. However, Public Utilities Code Section 5870 holds that the "existing franchise agreement shall otherwise apply to the incumbent franchisee until such expiration or termination." Therefore, the City's current franchise remains in force unless the agreement is terminated by City Council ordinance.

DISCUSSION/FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed termination of the incumbent CATV Franchise with Time Warner and its operation under a state franchise provides for the continued payment of franchise and PEG support fees. At present, in addition to receiving a 5% Franchise Fee, the City receives PEG fees of \$100,000 annually. By terminating the Agreement, the new 1% formula permitted under the State Franchise Agreement would result in annual PEG fee revenues of approximately \$141,000 annually.

Impact on City Resources and Policy

<u>Five Percent Franchise Fee</u> - In addition to PEG support fees, all franchise holders will continue to pay franchise fees to compensate the City for the use of public streets and rights-of-way. There are no material impacts on these revenues as a result of terminating the existing Time Warner CATV Franchise because DIVCA and Ordinance 2731 requires video service providers pay a 5% franchise fee.

<u>PEG Operations/In-kind Services</u> – Although the City will continue to collect franchise fees under a state franchise, support for in-kind services such as free cable service to schools and other public buildings and use of the Time Warner studio and playback facility will most likely be discontinued upon termination of the existing CATV Franchise. The existing franchise also calls for 20 cable TV "drops" at City facilities. The City currently has playback capacity and can adapt to a non-studio environment. The potential loss of free cable service could have an undetermined fiscal impact on schools located in the Garden Grove service area.

<u>Policy Implications</u> – Termination of the existing Time Warner CATV Franchise will achieve consistency among all franchise holders with respect to operations under DIVCA. In addition, the City will be on equal footing with all other municipalities served by Time Warner with respect to PEG support fees. Should no action be taken, PEG revenue will follow the contractually mandated annual decline until no fees are collected.

<u>Cable TV Rate Increase</u> – Time Warner pays a flat \$0.50 PEG fee. This will increase to 1% of the basic cable TV rate per subscriber. Staff estimates an average increase of \$0.21 per month using the first quarter FY 2010-2011 numbers as a base. Time Warner Cable serves an estimated 16,500 households in Garden Grove.

<u>Authority to act</u> - DIVCA authorizes the City to terminate the existing franchise agreement with Time Warner once a competitor notifies the City that it intends to provide video services in the City pursuant to a state franchise. California Public Utilities Code Section 5930(c) provides:

(c) When a video service provider that holds a state franchise provides the notice required pursuant to subdivision (n) of Section 5840 to a local entity, the local franchising entity may require all incumbent cable operators to seek a state franchise and shall terminate the franchise issued by the local franchising entity when the commission issues a state franchise for the video service provider that includes the entire service area served by the video service provider and the video service provider notifies the local entity that it will begin providing video service in that area under a state franchise.

Verizon and AT&T provided their notice to the City on March 8, 2007, and March 30, 2007, respectively, (see Attachment 1). Additionally, Time Warner received a state franchise to provide video services under DIVCA in its Orange County cities, including the Garden Grove, as of July 7, 2008 (see attached Public Utilities Commission Video franchise Certificate No. 0018). Thus, the requirements of Section 5930(c) have been satisfied.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council:

• Introduce and conduct the first reading of the attached Ordinance terminating the incumbent CATV Franchise with Time Warner Cable in accordance with Ordinance 2731 and the California Public Utilities Code.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2577 AND TERMINATING THE CABLE TELEVISION FRANCHISE GRANTED TO KBL CABLE SYSTEMS OF THE SOUTHWEST, INC., DOING BUSINESS AS TIME WARNER, PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA DIGITAL INFRASTRUCTURE AND VIDEO COMPETITION ACT OF 2006

City Attorney's Summary

This Ordinance terminates Time Warner's local cable television franchise and requires it to operate under the State-issued franchise pursuant to the California Digital Infrastructure and Video Competition Act of 2006.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE HEREBY FINDS AND DETERMINES AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the State of California adopted the California Digital Infrastructure and Video Competition Act of 2006 (DIVCA), providing for the issuance of state-wide video services franchises;

WHEREAS, the City of Garden Grove amended its cable television franchise regulations in August 2008 to comply with DIVCA;

WHEREAS, DIVCA authorizes incumbent cable franchise operators and local jurisdictions that had issued local cable franchises to unilaterally terminate the local franchises once a new video services provider enters the market to compete with the incumbent cable franchise operator;

WHEREAS, Verizon and AT&T have entered the video services market in the City of Garden Grove and compete with Time Warner, the incumbent cable franchise operator; and

WHEREAS, Time Warner Cable, LLC, has obtained a state franchise to provide video services in the City of Garden Grove.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDEN GROVE DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 2577 is hereby repealed.

Section 2. The cable television franchise granted to KBL Cable Systems of the Southwest, Inc., doing business as Time Warner, is hereby terminated pursuant to Section 5930(c) of the California Public Utilities Code. Furthermore, all obligations to pay franchise fees and PEG support fees under the franchise shall terminate and shall

instead be subject to Chapter 25 of Title 5 of the Garden Grove Municipal Code and State law.

Section 3. To the extent asset transfers or additional applications are required to formalize the transfer of video services to Time Warner Cable, LLC or another legal entity for the continuation of Time Warner's cable television services in the City, KBL Cable Systems of the Southwest, Inc., or any of its successor entities are hereby directed to seek a state franchise pursuant to Sections 5930(c) and 5840 of the California Public Utilities Code and shall operate pursuant to a state franchise and comply with Chapter 25 of Title 5 of the Garden Grove Municipal Code, including the payment of franchise and PEG support fees as required thereunder.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, word, or portion of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have adopted this Ordinance and each section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, word, or portion thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, sentences, clauses, phrases, words or portions thereof be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

<u>Section 5</u>. The Mayor shall sign and the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same, or the summary thereof, to be published and posted pursuant to the provisions of law and this Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after adoption.
