OBJECTIVE

To provide City Council with information regarding a proposal for a Mediterranean Festival at Village Green Park beginning Friday, September 21 through Sunday, September 23, 2018.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

In October 2017, staff received a written request from G Final Cut Inc. (YallaMazzika Radio Station), a non-profit organization established in Anaheim, requesting to conduct a three-day Mediterranean Festival at Village Green Park. The organization was established in 2017 with the mission to document, preserve, celebrate and educate the public on the history, life, art, and contributions of the Mediterranean culture. Staff has verified this is a 501(c)3 organization in good standing.

The purpose of the Mediterranean Festival is to build community pride nationwide and showcase the diversity of music, arts, and cultures. It will bring multi-generational and multi-cultural families together to enjoy free music, arts and crafts, entertainment, children's activities, and services from local businesses, foods, and vendors. This would be a first annual event, as this organization has not hosted a festival of this kind in the past. There would be admission fee of \$5 or less, amount has not been determined at this time.

Staff is requesting that City Council contact the City Manager with any questions or concerns regarding the proposed festival. If there are no concerns, then staff will prepare a formal agreement and request City Council approval to allow G Final Cut Inc. to conduct a three-day Mediterranean Festival at Village Green Park.

Infestations of an invasive insect, the Asian citrus psyllid (ACP), have been detected in citrus trees in and around Westminster. ACP extract large amounts of sap from plants or trees as the pests feed and produce copious amounts of honeydew. The honeydew then coats leaves and leads to the growth of mold. However, the most serious damage caused by the ACP is its ability to transmit a bacterial disease called Huanglongbing (HLB) to citrus trees. HLB is fatal to citrus trees. Establishment of ACP and HLB in California will threaten California's citrus industry and residential citrus trees.

A public meeting will be held on Wednesday, December 20, 2017, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., at the Westminster Community Services Building, East Room, located at 8200 Westminster Boulevard in Westminster. The CDFA and cooperating agencies will be present to answer any questions regarding the program for interested citizens in the treatment area.

A diluted formulation of Tempo® SC Ultra (cyfluthrin), a contact insecticide, will be applied to the leaves of citrus trees and plants to counter Asian citrus psyllid adults and nymphs. Additionally, a diluted formulation of Merit® 2F, an imidacloprid insecticide, will be applied to soil beneath the drip line of citrus trees and plants to protect against developing nymphs and subsequent adult psyllids. These materials will be applied at least one time at designated residential properties. Residents of affected properties will be notified individually at least 48 hours prior to any application of insecticides.

The Asian citrus psyllid (ACP), a serious insect pest in California, has been detected in your neighborhood. The ACP is a tiny, flying insect that transmits a bacterial disease called huanglongbing (HLB) to citrus trees. Trees infected with the HLB disease produce bitter and misshapen fruit. The HLB disease is fatal to citrus trees. The ACP is a threat to California's backyard and commercially grown citrus. Emergency treatment and quarantine action is needed to protect California from the negative economic and environmental impacts the establishment of this pest throughout California would cause.

The California Department of Food and Agriculture consulted with scientists who are experts in the biology of this pest. These experts have recommended a treatment plan designed to mitigate the infestation.

Limited ground treatments with a formulation of a pyrethroid will be applied to the foliage of citrus trees on your property. At the same time, an imidacloprid insecticide will be applied to the soil beneath the citrus trees for ongoing protection against the ACP. CDFA will follow all pesticide label directions.

Residents of properties scheduled for treatment will be notified at least 48 hours prior to the application. Included in this packet is a map outlining the project area.

To inform you of planned activities, residents of the affected area are invited to attend an open house meeting on Wednesday, December 20, 2017, between 5:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. –in the Westminster Community Services building East Room in Westminster, California. The open house will not feature a formal presentation; rather, it will be staffed by cooperating agency officials familiar with this program who will be able to individually address your concerns and answer any questions. Please feel free to stop by at any time during the scheduled 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. time frame.

El psílido asiático de los cítricos, es una plaga seria para California, y ha sido detectado en su barrio. El psílido es un insecto pequeño que vuela y puede transmitir la bacteria que causa la enfermedad de huanglongbing (HLB) exclusivamente a los cítricos. Los síntomas del HLB incluyen brotes amarillos, hojas amarillentas con moteado asimétrico y erectas. Los frutos son irregulares y de sabor amargo. El HLB puede matar a los cítricos. El psílido es una amenaza para los cítricos en los jardines y a los cítricos comercialmente cultivados. Para proteger a California del impacto negativo que esta enfermedad de los cítricos causaría a su economía y medio ambiente, es necesario llevar a cabo tratamientos como medida de emergencia.

El Departamento de Alimentos y Agricultura de California ha consultado con científicos que son expertos en la biología de esta plaga. Estos expertos recomendaron que es necesario un plan de tratamiento para poder ser efectivos en la mitigación de este insecto.

El Departamento de Alimentos y Agricultura de California va a hacer aplicaciones al follaje de los cítricos en su propiedad aplicando una formulación de piretroide. A la misma vez va a haber aplicaciones terrestres bajo de los cítricos con una insecticida de tipo imidacloprid para protegerlos del psílido. El Departamento de Alimentos y Agricultura de California va a seguir todas las instrucciones indicadas en la etiqueta del insecticida.

Los residentes serán notificados 48 horas antes de cada tratamiento. Adjunto a este aviso hay un mapa del área de tratamiento y un panfleto sobre el psílido.

Para informales sobre las acciones que se han programado, los residentes de las áreas afectadas son invitados a atender una reunión informativa el miércoles, 20 de diciembre, 2017, entre las horas de 5:30 p.m. y 7:00 p.m. en la sala este del Edificio de Servicios Comunitarios de Westminster en Westminster, California. Rầy Chổng Cánh (Asian citrus psyllid-ACP), một loại côn trùng gây hại nghiêm trọng tại California, đã được phát hiện trong khu xóm của bạn. Con Rầy Chổng Cánh (ACP) là loại côn trùng biết bay có thể lây truyền một căn bệnh do vi khuẩn gây ra được gọi là bệnh hoàng long (HLB) cho các cây họ cam quýt. Cây bị nhiễm bệnh HLB sinh ra trái có vị đắng và có hình dạng quái dị. Bệnh HLB sẽ làm chết cây họ cam quýt. Rầy Chổng Cánh (ACP) là mối đe dọa cho các cây họ cam quýt được trồng ở vườn sau các căn nhà ở và vườn cây công nghiệp tại California. Công trình phun diệt và kiểm dịch khẩn cấp cần được thực hiện để phòng tránh tác hại kinh tế và môi trường do sự sinh sôi nảy nở của loại côn trùng gây hại này gây ra cho khắp bang California.

Bộ Thực Phẩm và Canh Nông California đã tư vấn với các khoa học gia chuyên môn về sinh vật học của loại côn trùng này. Các nhà chuyên gia đã đề nghị một kế hoạch phun diệt nhằm giảm bớt sự tàn phá của loại côn trùng này.

Một công trình phun diệt trong vườn với tầm vóc giới hạn đang sử dụng hợp chất pyrethroid để phun lên cành lá của các cây họ cam quýt trồng trong khu nhà đất của bạn. Đồng thời, loại thuốc trừ sâu imidacloprid sẽ được rải xuống đất dưới gốc cây họ cam quýt để tạo năng lực phòng chống Rầy Chổng Cánh (ACP) lâu dài. Bộ Thực Phẩm và Canh Nông California sẽ tuân thủ tất cả các lời chỉ dẫn in trên nhãn của thuốc trừ sâu.

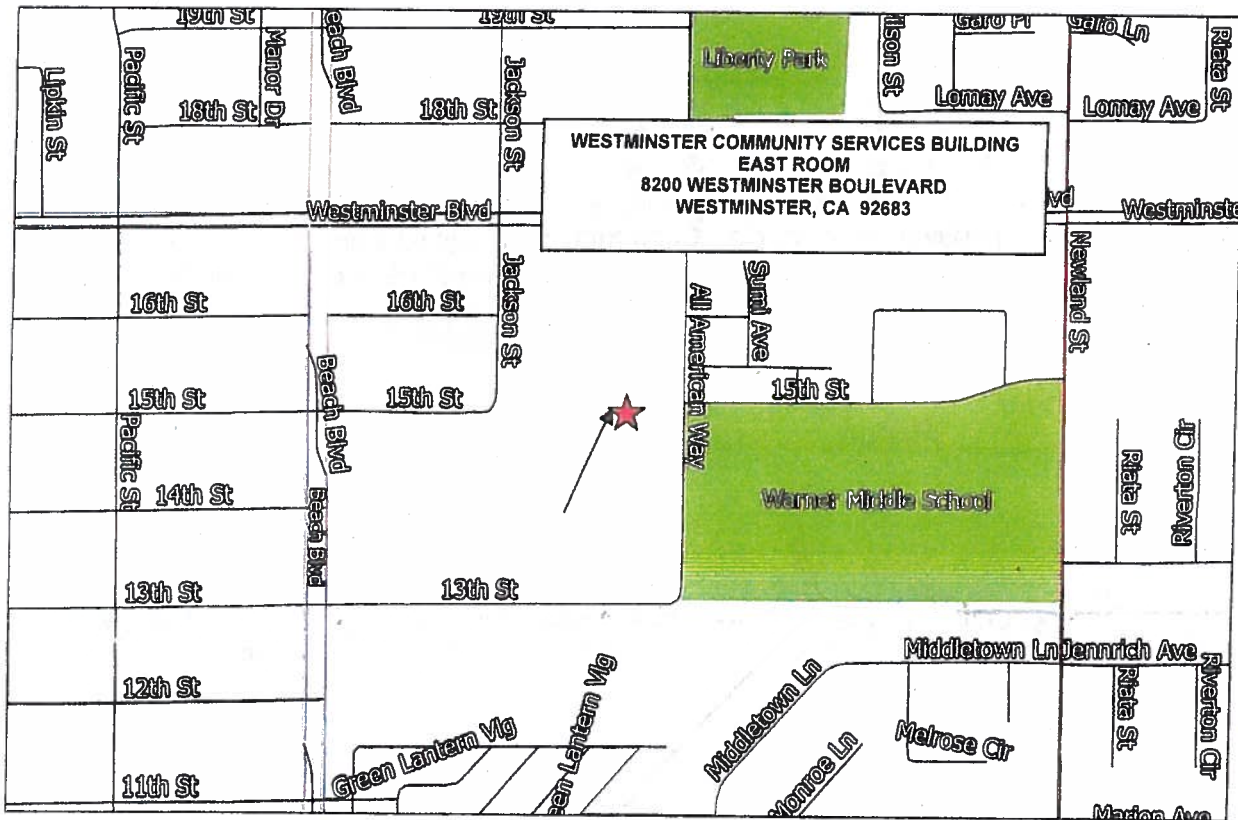
Những người cư ngụ tại những căn nhà đã được lên lịch phun thuốc diệt sâu sẽ được thông báo tối thiểu 48 giờ trước khi phun thuốc. Tập tài liệu này bao gồm cả một bản đồ đánh dấu rõ khu vực dự án.

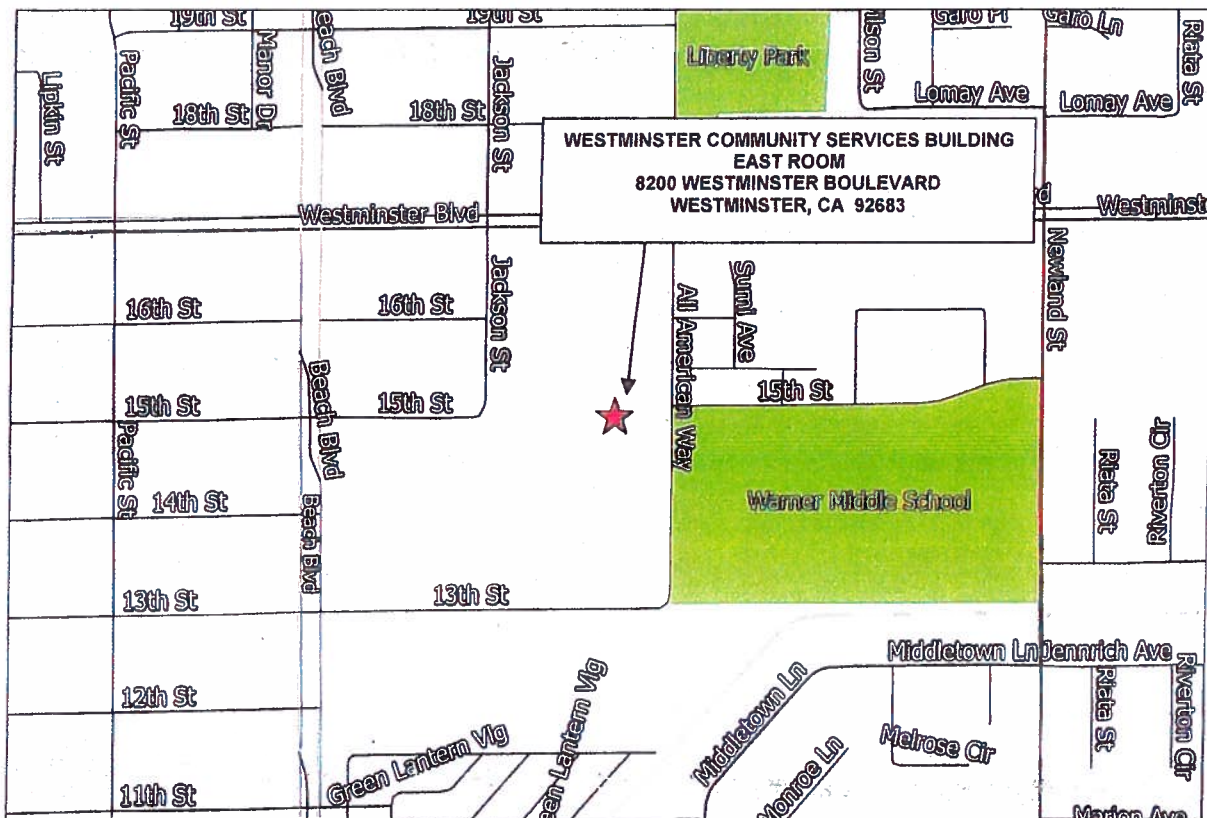

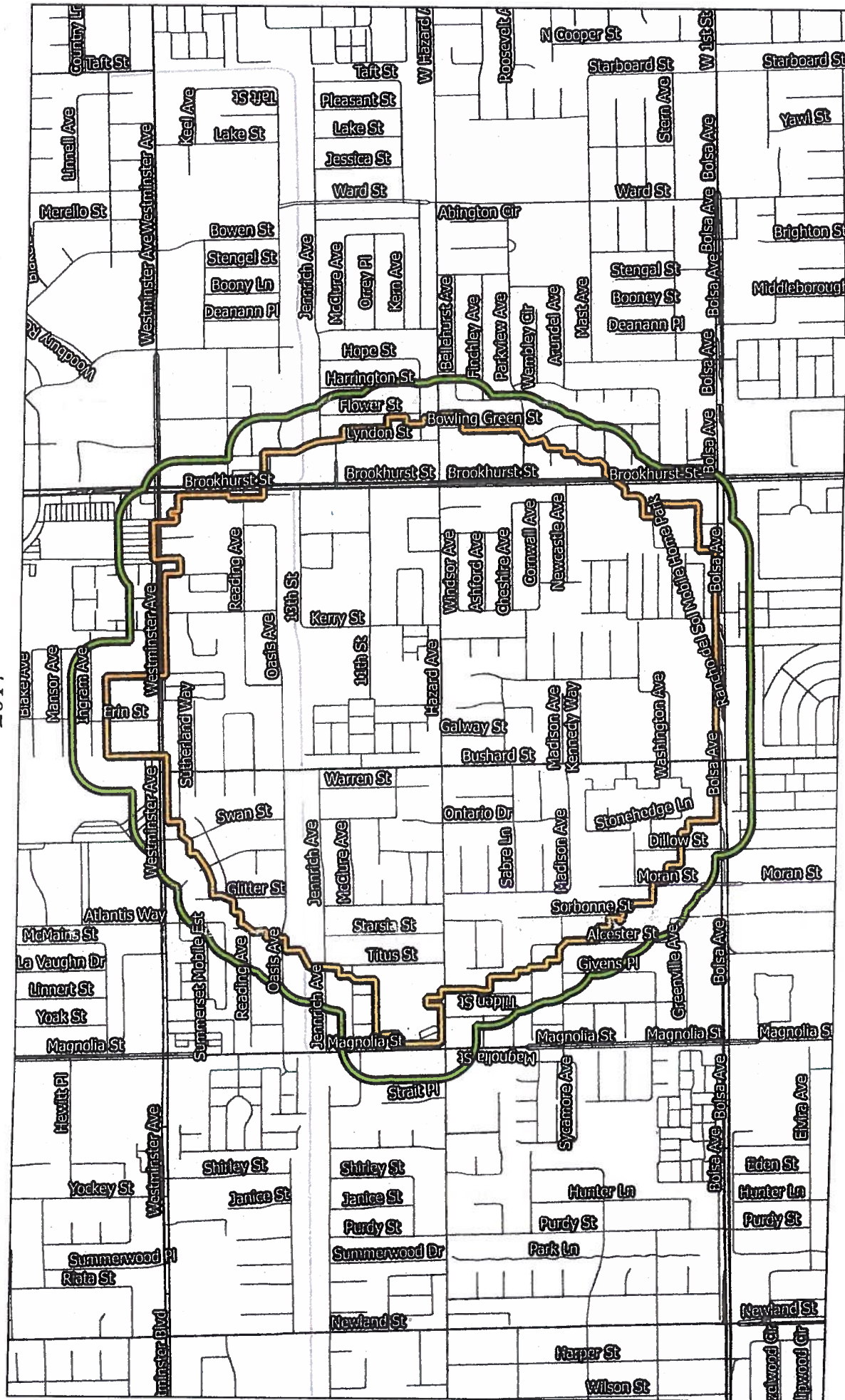

Fatal accident

A 71-year-old pedestrian crossing a street Friday night, Dec. 8, was killed when he was hit by a driver.

The crash was reported at 5:56 p.m. in a southbound lane of Brookhurst Street just north of Bixby Avenue.

The man, crossing eastbound in an area not marked by a crosswalk, was struck by a blue 2004 Infiniti G35 driven by a 22-year-old man, police said. The pedestrian died at the scene.

Sen. Nguyen receives top rating

In recognition of her efforts to enhance the public safety of California's more than 39 million residents, the California Police Chiefs Association (CPCA) has given Senator Janet Nguyen a "100%" rating on their 2017 Legislative Scorecard. The CPCA Legislative Scorecard is an annual report that tracks public safety legislation and measures how state legislators voted on important public safety-related bills.

"As a public safety advocate, my goal is to provide the community, as well as law enforcement, the tools necessary to deter crime and keep our children

and families safe," said Nguyen. "In this endeavor, I am proud to count on the support of law enforcement in my District as I fight for laws that protect our community."

Founded in 1966, the CPCA represents 330 active municipal police chiefs and their agencies. Association members are responsible for the public safety of more than 26 million Californians. To compile the 2017 Legislative Scorecard, CPCA evaluated votes on bills that impact the safety of Californians. Among the 11 bills considered for the Legislative Scorecard were bills that negatively impact

public safety such as Assembly Bill 186 (Eggman) which would allow "safe injection sites" for drug users, Senate Bill 54 (De Leon) which limits the cooperation of state law enforcement agencies with federal immigration authorities, and Senate Bill 620 (Bradford) which would allow judges to eliminate mandatory gun enhancements in sentencing. Nguyen's votes on all 11 bills were aligned with CPCA's position.

In her capacity as a legislator, Nguyen also assisted law enforcement by authoring Senate Bill 610 (SB 610), Erica's Law, which was signed by the

Governor in July 2017. This law extends the statute of limitations on cases of body concealment, to one year from the time a suspect is initially identified by law enforcement and places a four year limit from when the crime occurred. SB 610 effectively provides law enforcement authorities more time to hold those responsible for crimes of body concealment accountable.

Since being elected to the State Legislature in 2014, Nguyen has consistently proposed legislation to address crime. In 2015, Nguyen authored Senate Bill 353 (SB 353) to allocate savings from the 2011 Public Safety Realignment to local agencies to improve offender outcomes and enhance public safety. The

2011 Public Safety Realignment shifted the responsibility for lower-level felons from the state to counties but did not provide sufficient funds for local services that would protect public safety while holding offenders accountable. With this same goal in mind, in 2017, Senator Janet Nguyen partnered with the Orange County Sheriff's Department to introduce Senate Bill 284 (SB 284), a property crime bill that would have given law enforcement the option to book and hold violators who commit misdemeanor property crimes like burglary, theft, and shoplifting. Under current law, perpetrators of any of these crimes, are only cited and released if the items stolen are valued under \$950.

Ex-postal worker gets six years for stealing 6,000 credit cards

SANTA ANA » Calling the case a “sad and serious breach of public trust,” a federal judge on Monday sentenced a former United States postal worker to six years in prison for stealing more than 6,000 credit cards from undelivered mail.

Chinh Vuong, 49, of Garden Grove was a processing clerk in Santa Ana for more than two decades before being arrested in 2015 for stealing credit cards and selling them. His scam resulted in a loss of hundreds of thousands of dollars for Chase Bank and American Express, authorities said.

Vuong pleaded guilty in federal court last year to one count of conspiracy to commit bank fraud and one count of aggravated identity theft. He had faced up to 32 years in prison.

In his Monday sentencing, Judge Cormac Carney said the number of stolen credit cards was

troubling.

“This wasn’t just a few cards that were taken,” he said. “This is a threat to the stability of our financial system.”

In addition to federal prison time, Vuong was ordered to pay about \$295,000 in restitution to Chase and \$30,000 to American Express.

Prosecutors said Vuong, a mail clerk since 1989, stole at least 6,240 credit cards in just one year by stuffing them into his waistband and carrying them out to his car on his breaks. Authorities said he targeted cards in envelopes that were marked as “undeliverable.”

At least some of the thefts occurred while Chase was replacing old-style credit cards with chip cards, so there was a higher volume of cards being mailed out.

Vuong would then sell the cards, offering, for example, 11 cards for \$500, or 132 for \$5,000, with his customers then making unauthorized purchases.

Prosecutors said he made at least \$6,000 a month off of the scam, spending the funds on personal expenses such as designer handbags and boots and two BMWs.

In June 2015, he sold hundreds of cards to two law enforcement informants. Authorities then searched his Garden Grove home and seized 199 more stolen credit cards, and luxury items bought with the cards, including two dozen handbags by Prada, Louis Vuitton, Gucci and other brands.

Speaking before the judge Monday, Vuong apologized and said he felt remorse for his “poor choices and stupid mistakes.”

Also speaking in court, a brother, Quan Vuong, asked the judge for leniency and said Vuong has already lost his savings and his retirement pension. He said Vuong, who came from Vietnam as a refugee, has brought shame and embarrassment to his family.

“This country has been so good to us, and we are sorry to have let it down,” he said. “But we know he can change. He has changed for the better.”

PastaThon inspires charity by the ton

GARDEN GROVE » Five a.m. is usually a bit early for pasta, but that's what drew radio personalities from KFI/640 AM and a horde of volunteers to the Christ Cathedral at dawn on Friday.

They gathered for Anaheim chef Bruno Serato's annual PastaThon, a fundraiser for his nonprofit that feeds pasta dinners to 3,500 hungry kids daily.

By midmorning, as KFI broadcast live in front of a roomful of listeners, the event had collected more than \$100,000 and nearly 9,500 pounds of pasta and sauce.

At 9 p.m., the totals had grown to \$366,412 and 67,657 pounds of future dinners. The PastaThon was scheduled to end at 10 p.m.

Eric Chan, who bought a copy of Serato's new book and had the chef sign it, drove in from San Gabriel.

Chan wanted to support the event because he's a KFI fan, but also "the more that I get to know about this charity; they do some great work."

Out in the parking lot, cars cycled through, dropping off donations as volunteers buzzed back and forth, weighing boxes of pasta and jars of sauce before packing them onto pallets.

They'll be taken to a warehouse for storage until they're needed by Caterina's Club, Serato's nonprofit that serves meals at 62 locations in Orange County, Long Beach and Los Angeles.

"We love that they're making an impact right here in this community," said Kyle Mastin, a volunteer whose marketing firm works with Caterina's Club.

The seventh annual PastaThon was held at the

Christ Cathedral this year because its usual venue, Serato's historic Anaheim White House restaurant, is being rebuilt after it was gutted by fire in February.

Kevin Dickson, who lives in Yorba Linda, came by Friday afternoon to donate several boxes of pasta and jars of sauce before checking out the KFI broadcast.

He knew Serato helps feed children whose families live in motels.

"I just felt good about dropping off some stuff to help out," he said.

A big assist came from grocery chain Smart & Final.

After offering customers the chance to buy \$10 donation bags of pasta and sauce at 22 stores last year, the company expanded the program to 170 Southern California stores this year and also provided pallets, a truck and more than 30 volunteers to collect, sort and transport donations.

Crystal Schain, a regional marketing representative for Smart & Final, said about 3,000 bags were sold over the past two weeks.

"I just fell in love with the whole concept of helping those who help others," she said.

The company now plans to take part in the fundraiser annually.

PastaThon event to aid hungry kids set for Friday

GARDEN GROVE » Instead of loaves and fish, Italian chef Bruno Serato feeds multitudes with the meal he knows best.

Since 2005, he's been serving daily pasta dinners to an ever-growing number of hungry children in and around Orange County. Even a February fire that destroyed his historic Anaheim restaurant, the White House, didn't stop Serato and Caterina's Club, the 12-year-old charity he named for his mother, from filling empty stomachs.

The group feeds 3,500 every night.

After the fire, the Diocese of Orange's Bishop Kevin Vann offered the commercial kitchen at Christ Cathedral in Garden Grove as a place to prepare pasta so no child missed a meal, diocese spokesman Ryan Lilygren said.

On Friday, the cathedral will host the annual PastaThon, a fundraiser for Caterina's Club. It's the first time the event won't be held at Serato's restaurant, but the chef is taking it in stride. In fact, Serato said, he's excited in part because Christ Cathedral is one of the most-visited places in Orange County.

"At the Catholic church, the No. 1 priority is feeding the poor," he said. "I could not find any better place than the Christ Cathedral to exercise what we do."

Last year, the event collected more than \$290,000 and 90,200 pounds in pasta and tomato sauce.

Radio hosts from KFI/640 AM will broadcast from the PastaThon all day, and a Mass will be held at noon for any who want to attend. Volunteers will collect donations of money and uncooked pasta and sauce, and visitors can tour the cathedral campus.

The chef has held cooking classes for at-risk youths

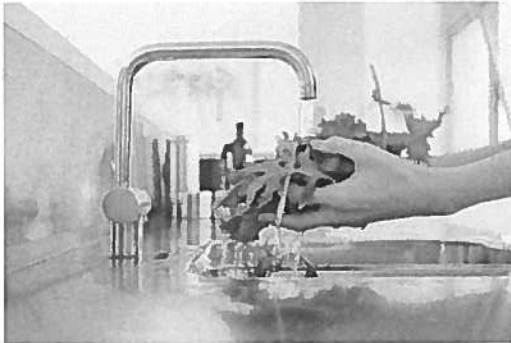
