Amir El-Farra is Garden Grove's new chief of police.

A 27-year law enforcement veteran, El-Farra is the department's deputy chief, a role he has served in since 2021. He takes over the helm of the Garden Grove Police from Chief Tom DaRé, who retires at the end of the year.

El-Farra officially begins his new assignment at the start of the new year, on Jan. 1.

"My highest priority is to maintain our strong partnership with the community and ensure the highest commitment to service, safety, and protection," El-Farra said in a statement.

El-Farra began his career with the Garden Grove Police as an officer in 2008, following a stint with the Los Angeles Police Department. He was named Sergeant of the Year in 2015, and in 2019, as a captain, he oversaw the department's largest bureau, which includes K-9, SWAT, special investigations and more, according to the city.

In announcing the new police chief, Garden Grove City Manager Scott Stiles said, "Deputy Chief El-Farra has the proven character, drive, and abilities necessary to successfully lead the Garden Grove Police Department. His ascension through the ranks has been impressive, and his dedication and enthusiasm for the Garden Grove community is profound."

The downtown area of Garden Grove is known as a location for special events such as the Strawberry Festival in the Village Green park and the Elvis Festival on Main Street.

Now a third major gathering is planned for January: the "Flower Street on Historic Main Street." Plans call for turning one block of Main, between Acacia Parkway and Garden Grove Boulevard, into a colorful flower extravaganza in keeping with similar events held in Vietnam.

The "Flower Street" will blossom on Saturday, Jan. 21 and Sunday, Jan. 22 in step with the Tet lunar new year, "The Year of the Cat." Several organizations are partnering to produce the event.

At a press conference on Main Street on Saturday, organizer Johnny Nguyen screened a slide slow showing plans to turn that stretch of the city's original central business district into a colorful panorama of flora, along with a variety of events including a pet costume contest.

"The flower streets are popular attractions in Vietnam," he said. "Many people never get the chance to experience it."

"For the first time ever we want to bring a flower street to California. Borrowing from this unique lunar new year tradition, we will add our own touches." The theme of this inaugural event is "Spring" and there will be "large flower installations, unique artwork and and a light display."

He went on to emphasize that he wanted the event to be inclusive and be welcoming to all ethnicities in Garden Grove.

Cherrie Hoa Mai, director of art for the event, remarked that part of the purpose of the event will be to help connect the second generation of Vietnamese-Americans – the children of the refugees who fled Indochina after the Communist conquest in 1975 – with the lives of their parents and ancestors, many of whom lived in rural settings and helped produce food.

"We must honor the farmers," she said. "Food is life." She added, "Young people today here have everything," and scant knowledge of how life was for their parents and grandparents before the grand exodus after the fall of Saigon.

Newly-seated Councilmember Joe VoDinh spoke briefly, praising the project and the diversity of the city.

DEPUTY CHIEF NAMED CITY'S NEW POLICE CHIEF

Garden Grove City Manager Scott Stiles has named Deputy Chief Amir El-Farra as Garden Grove's new chief of police. A 27-year law enforcement veteran, El-Farra became the department's deputy chief in 2021, serving second in command to former police chief Tom DaRé. He officially begins his new assignment on January 1, 2023.

"I am honored and humbled to continue working with the extraordinary men and women of the Garden Grove Police Department in this new capacity. My highest priority is to maintain our strong partnership with the community and ensure the highest commitment to service, safety, and protection," says El-Farra.

"Deputy Chief El-Farra has the proven character, drive, and abilities necessary to successfully lead the Garden Grove Police Department. His ascension through the ranks has been impressive, and his dedication and enthusiasm for the Garden Grove community is profound. I have no doubt that our community will place their deepest trust in him as I have," says City Manager Scott Stiles.

El-Farra began his career with the Garden Grove Police Department as a police officer in 2008, following prior service with the Los Angeles Police Department. He advanced beyond the normal course of promotions to become an acting sergeant in 2013, and sergeant in 2014, earning the title of Sergeant of the Year in 2015.

In 2016, he was promoted to lieutenant, and in 2019 to captain, overseeing the largest bureau in the police department that includes SWAT, K-9, patrol, gangs, special investigations, the Special Resources Team (SRT), and motorcycle unit.

In 2021, he became the police department's deputy chief, providing vital leadership in the City's and police department's Emergency Operation Centers during the COVID-19 crisis.

El-Farra has worked a variety of assignments during his career with the Garden Grove Police Department and held many adjunct duties, including service and involvement on the department's Community Policing Committee, the Citizen's Police Academy, and the Chief's Advisory Council which interacts with leaders in the community. During his career, he has also served as a field training officer for new recruits, and an instructor on arrest and control techniques. He has also received numerous awards and commendations and obtained various professional credentials throughout his career. He has completed the Orange County Cohort Leadership Course and is a member of the California Chiefs of Police Association.

A graduate of Humboldt State University, where he excelled as a collegiate athlete, El-Farra has been married to his wife, Erinn, for 26 years. They have four children and a grandson.

In observance of the Christmas and New Year's Day holidays, Garden Grove
City Hall and the H. Louis Lake Senior Center will be closed from Monday,
December 26, 2022 through Monday, January 2, 2023.

Street sweeping services will not be provided on Sunday, December 25, 2022 and Sunday, January 1, 2023. Streets will be swept as scheduled on all other days. There will be no street sweeping enforcement from Monday, December 26, 2022 through Monday, January 2, 2023. Street sweeping enforcement will resume on Tuesday, January 3, 2023. Trash pickup will not be provided on Monday, December 26, 2022 and Monday, January 2, 2023. Trash pickup will be delayed by one day for the remainder of those weeks.

Republic Services will provide free pick up of holiday trees during a three-week period, beginning Tuesday, December 27, 2022 through Saturday, January 14, 2023. Trees must be out by 7:00 a.m. on regular trash collection days. Flocked trees are not recyclable and are not eligible for the free collection, but may be disposed of in the regular trash container or by scheduling a bulky item pick up.
