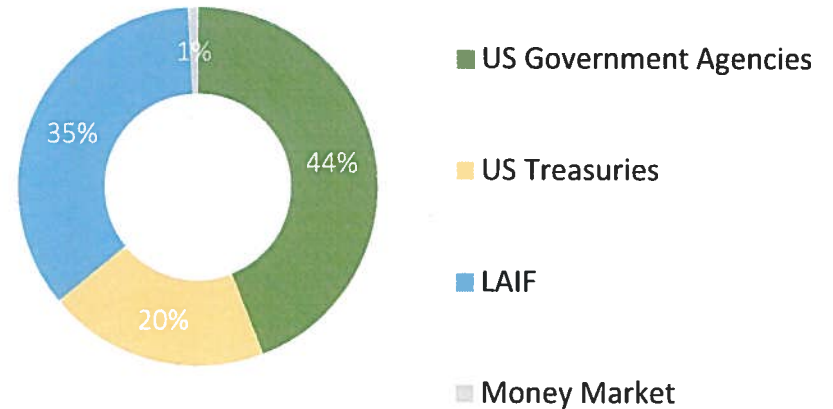

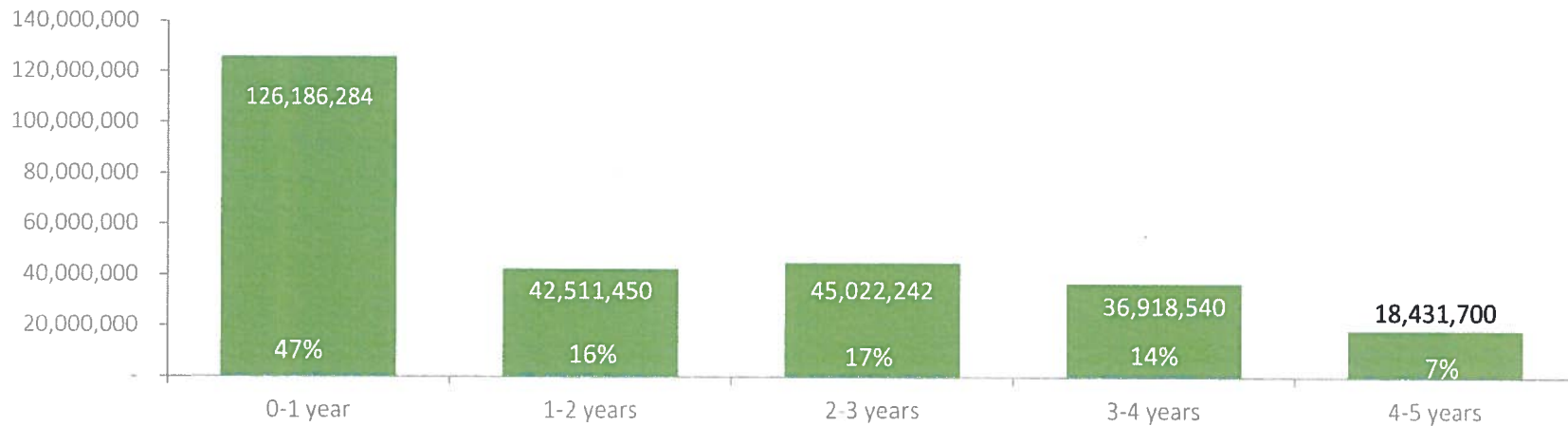

## Your Portfolio Distribution

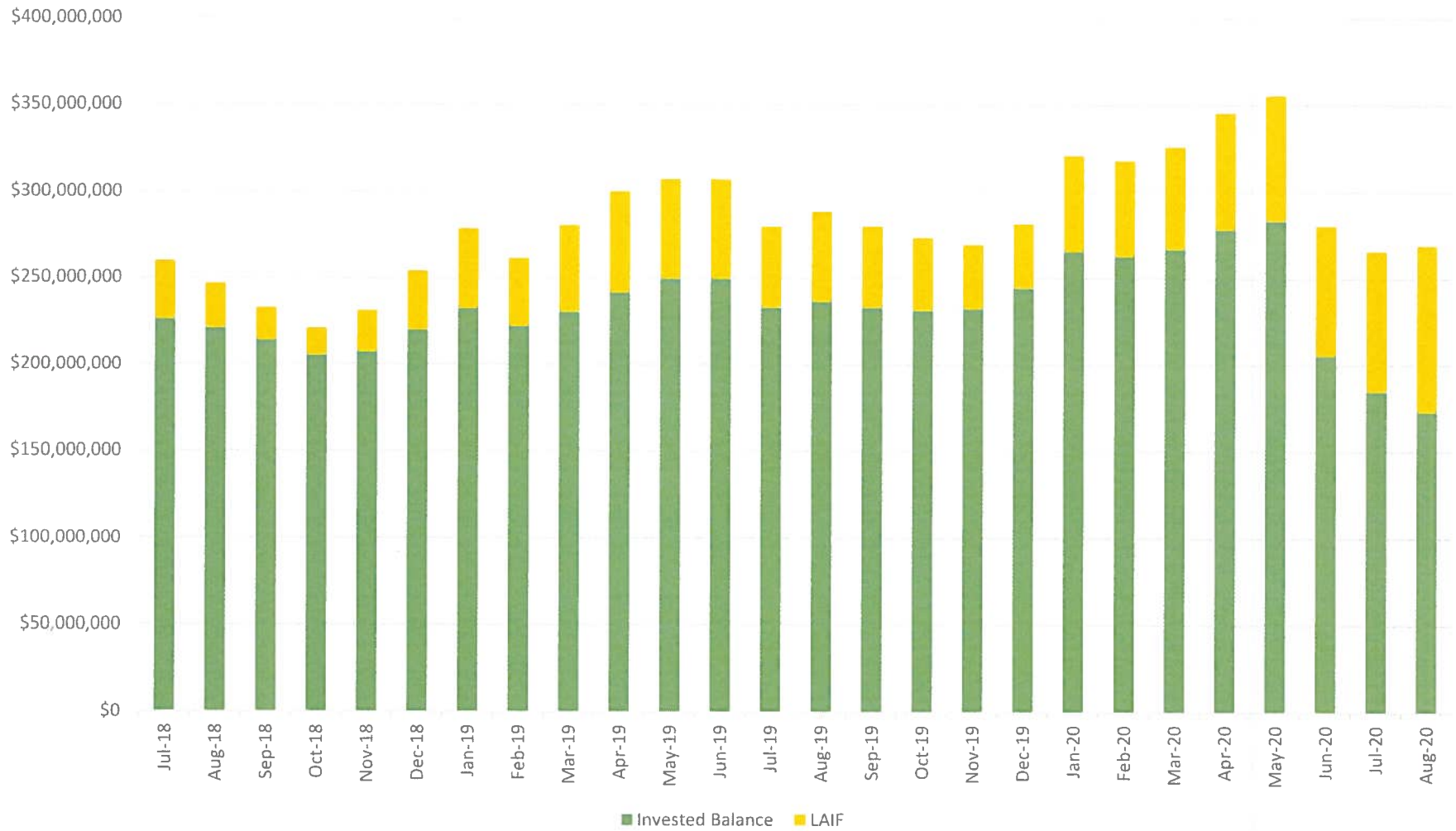

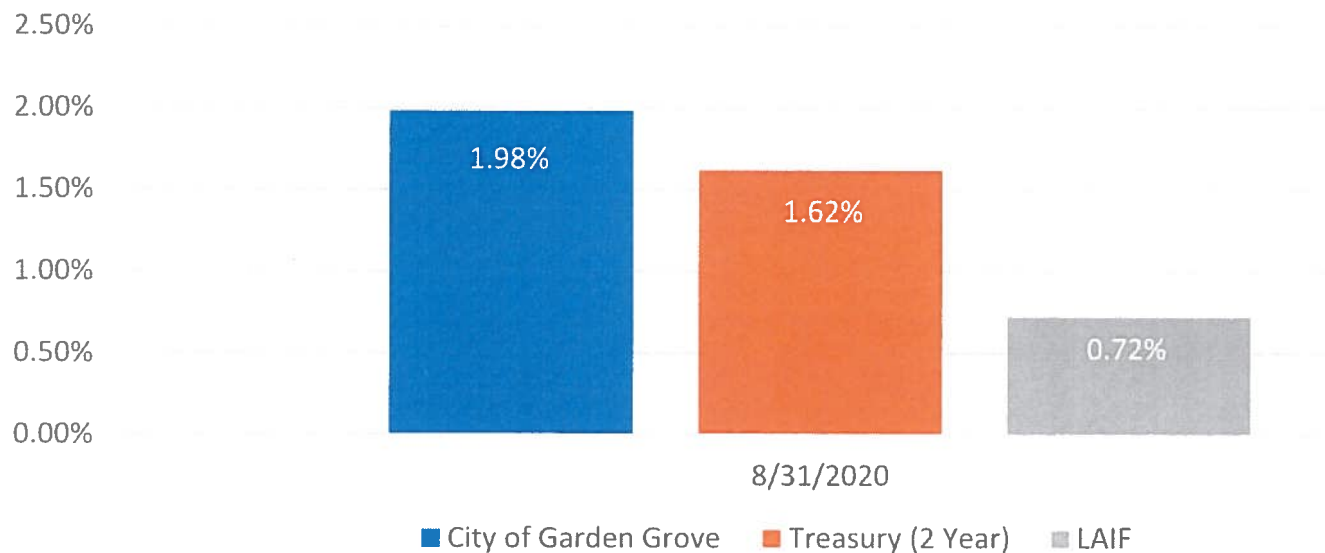

# MARKET COMMENTARY

August 2020

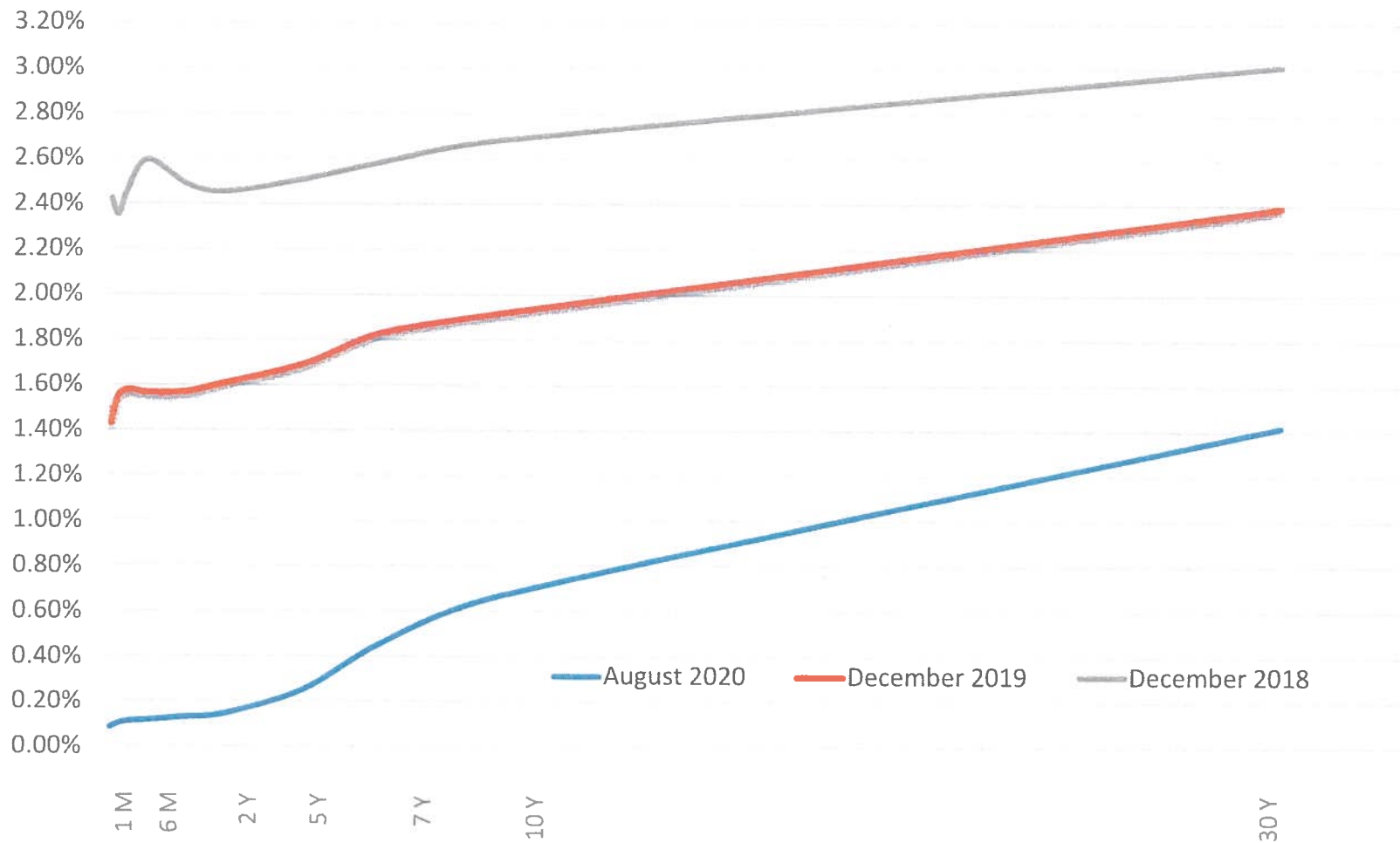
In the month of August, initial jobless claims dipped below 1 million for the first time since the coronavirus pandemic. Prior to the pandemic new claims were running in the low 200,000s and the labor market was seeing some of the best numbers in almost 50 years.

According to the August PMI report, the manufacturing sector increased slightly in August, compared with the previous month. The PMI index read 56%, which was 1.8% higher than in July. This figure indicates expansion in the overall economy and has grown for the fourth month in a row after a contraction in April, which ended a period of 131 consecutive months of growth.

The economy appeared to have survived a major summer outbreak of the coronavirus better than it initially anticipated. However, many uncertainties lie ahead for the rest of the year.



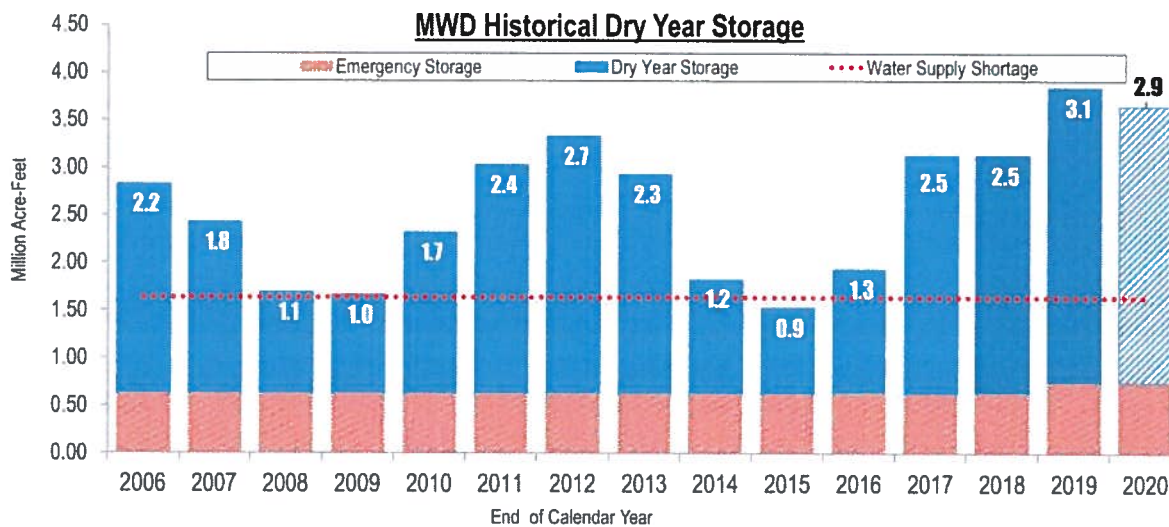

**SUBJECT:** Monthly Water Usage Data, Tier 2 Projection & Water Supply Information

With estimated total demands and losses of 1.636 million acre-feet (MAF) and with a 20% SWP Table A Allocation, Metropolitan is projecting that demands will exceed supply levels in Calendar Year (CY) 2020. Based on this, estimated total dry-year storage for Metropolitan at the end of ***CY 2020 will go down to approximately 2.9 MAF.***

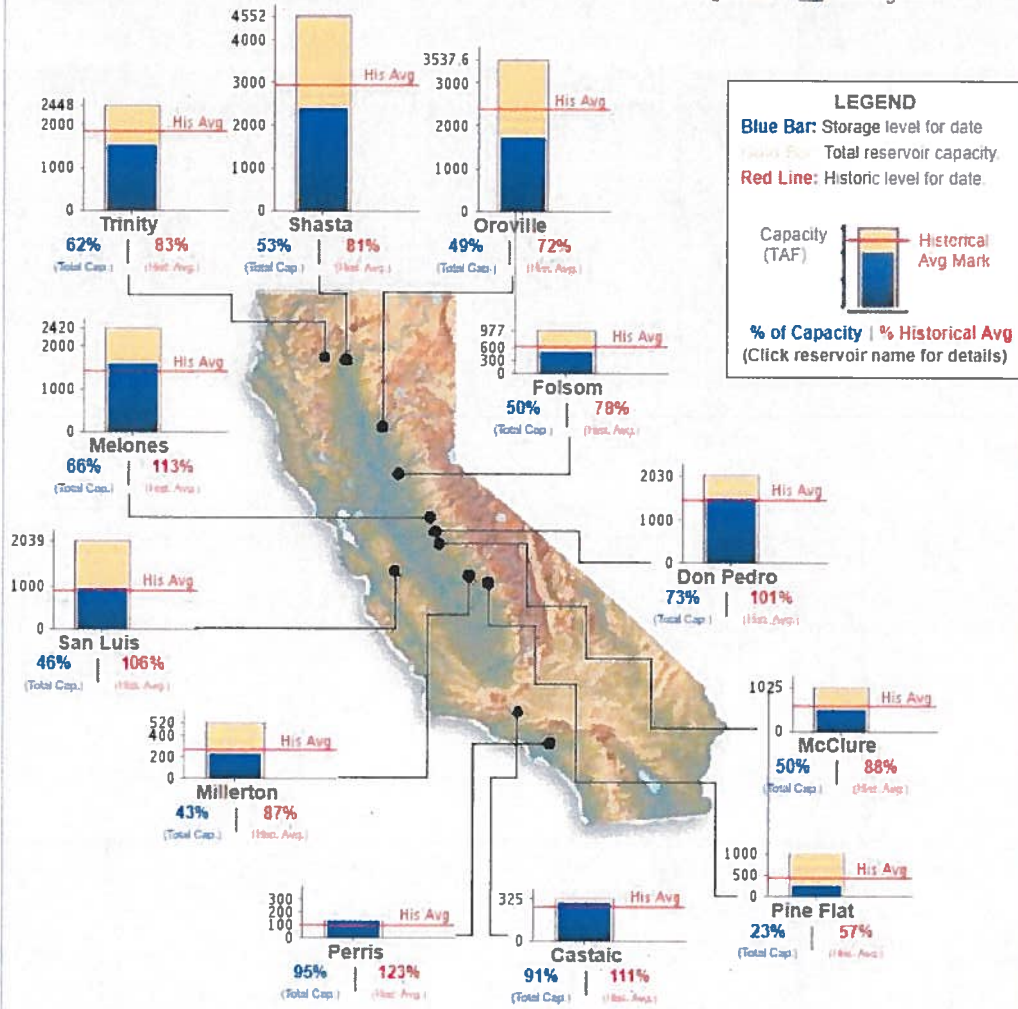
A projected dry-year storage supply of ***2.9 MAF will be the second highest amount for Metropolitan.*** A large factor in the increase in water storage is because ***water demands regionally have been at approximately 36-year lows.***



**CURRENT CONDITIONS FOR MAJOR RESERVOIRS: 24-AUG-2020**

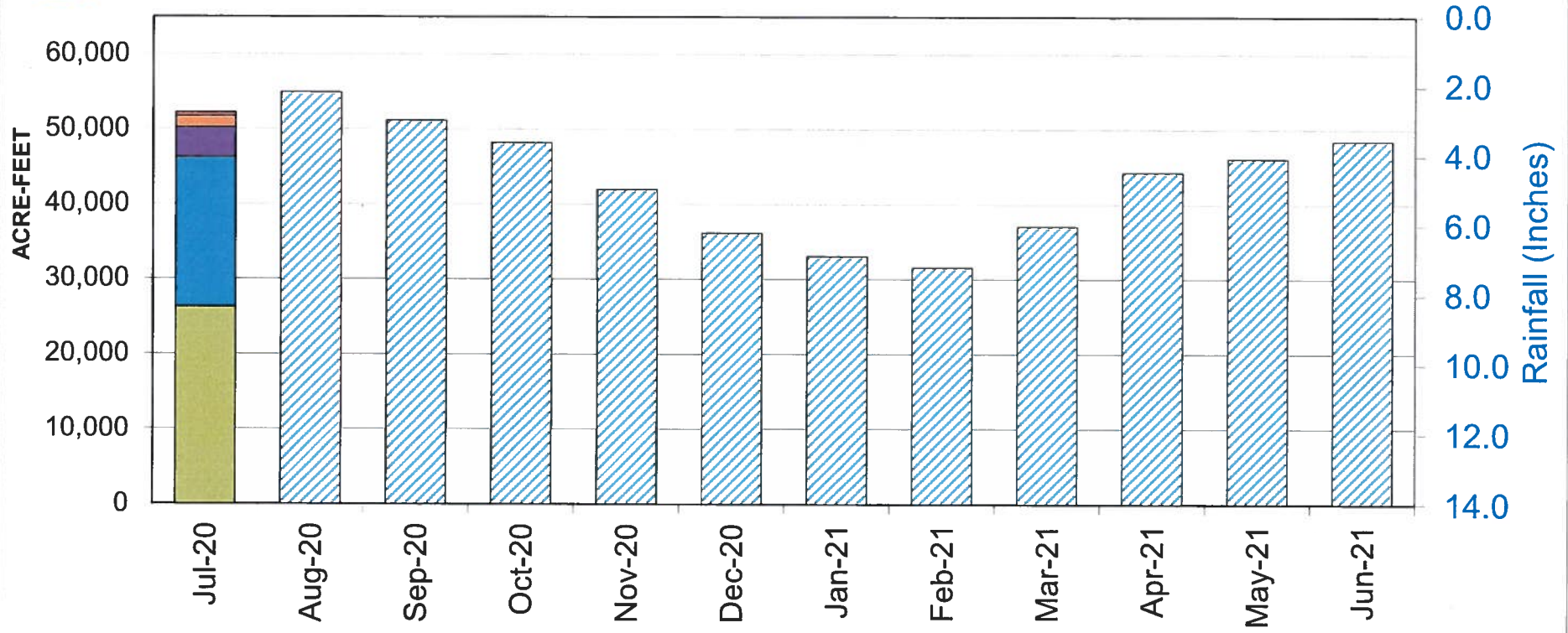

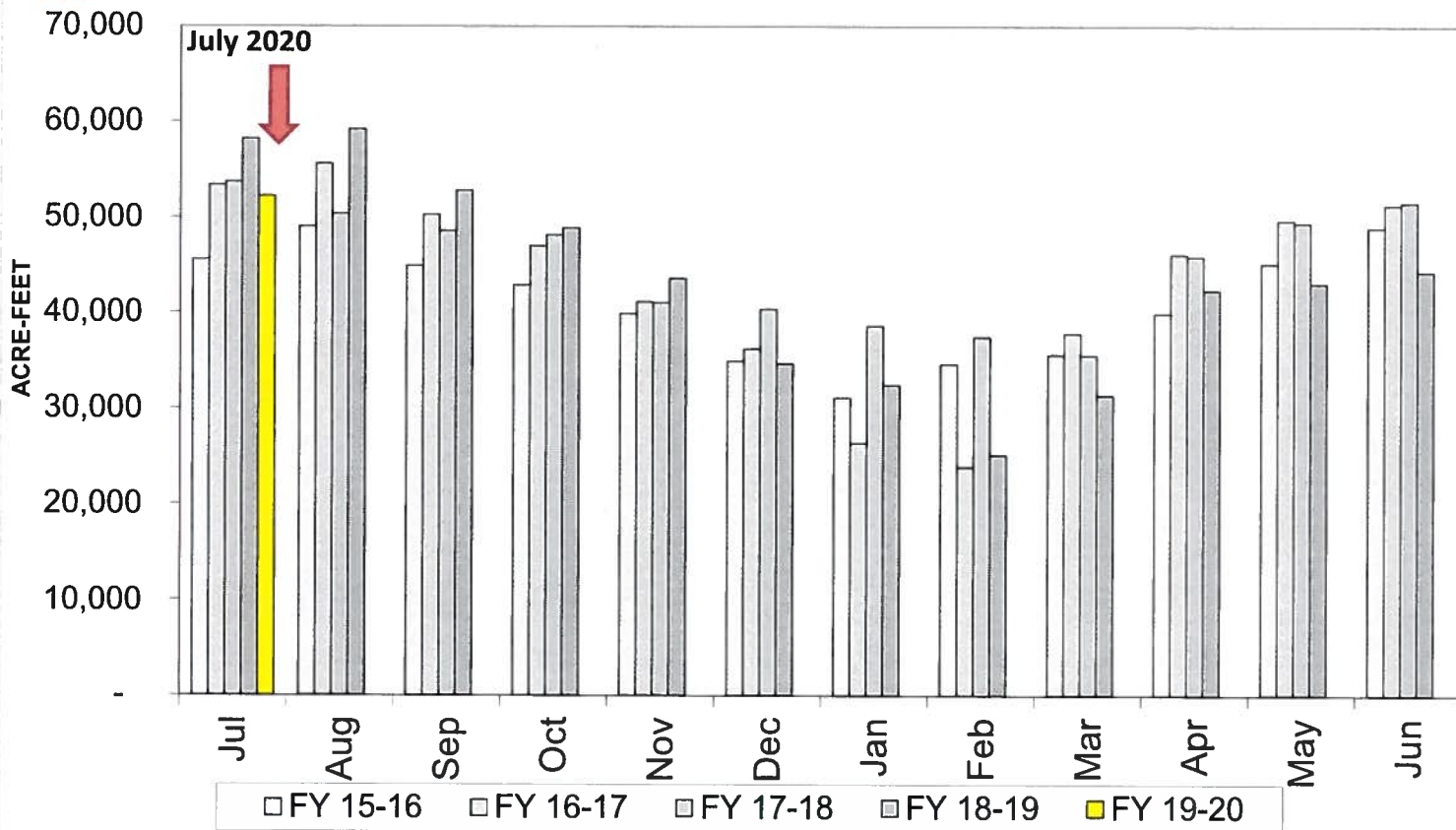
**Fig. 1 OC Water Usage, Monthly by Supply with projection to end of fiscal year**



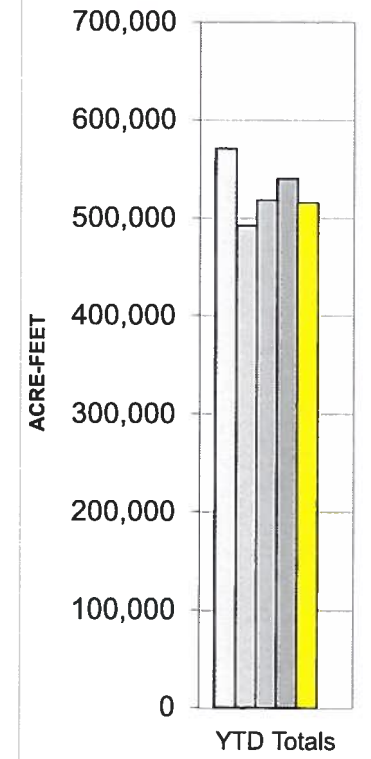

**Fig. 2 OC Monthly Water Usage [1]: Comparison to Last 4 Fiscal Years**

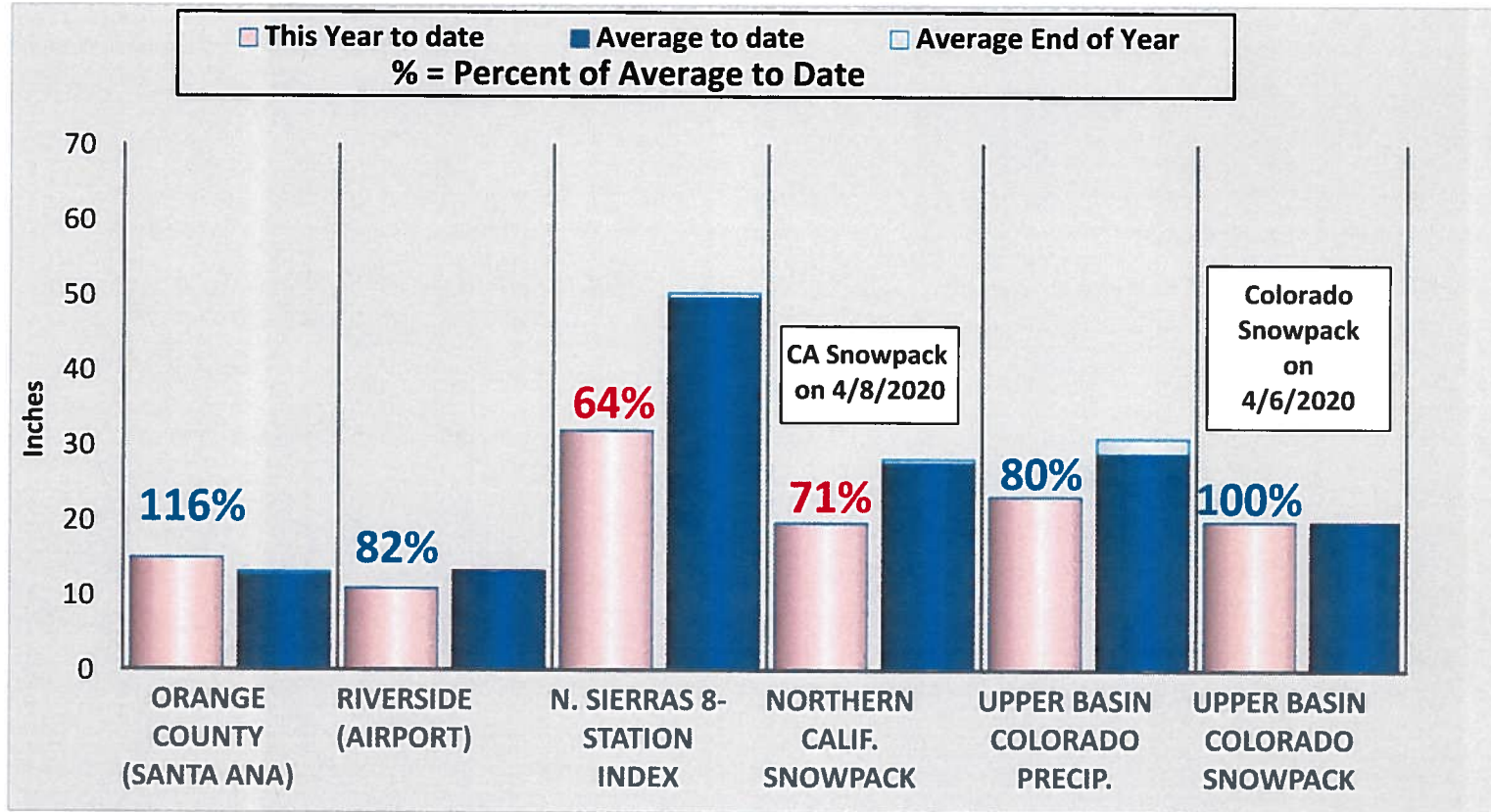

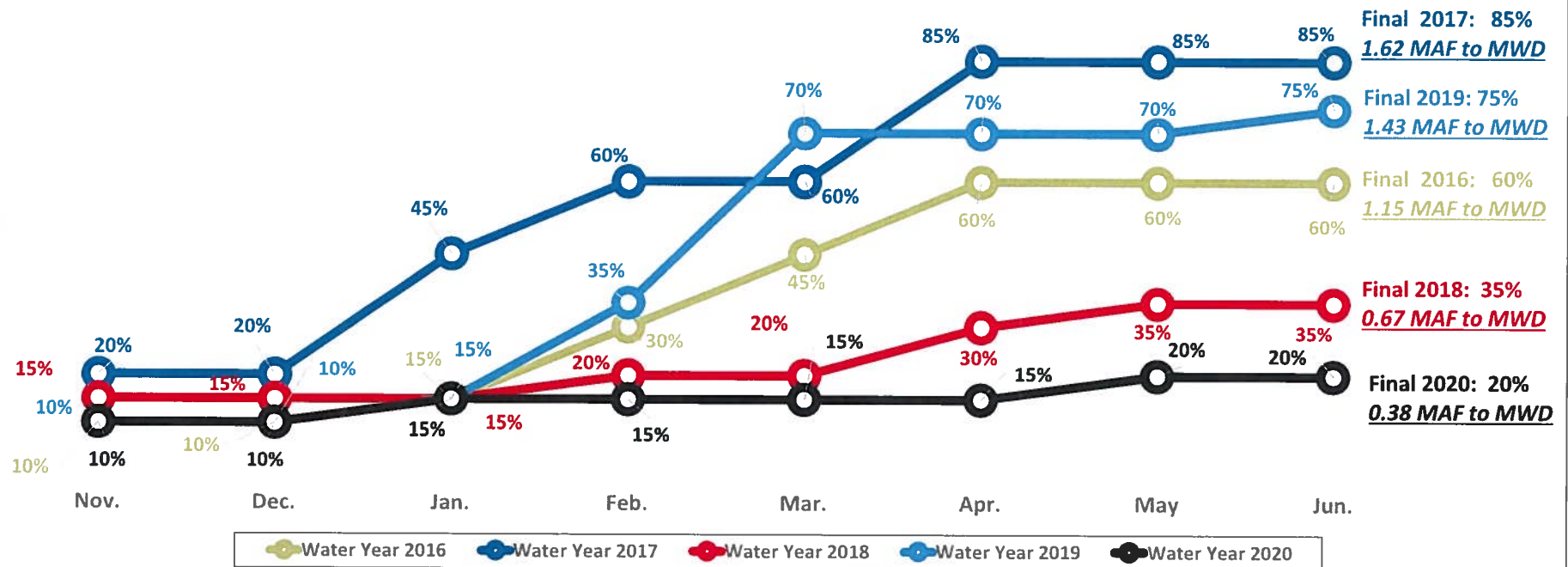
# Accumulated Precipitation for the Oct.-Sep. water year, early September 2020

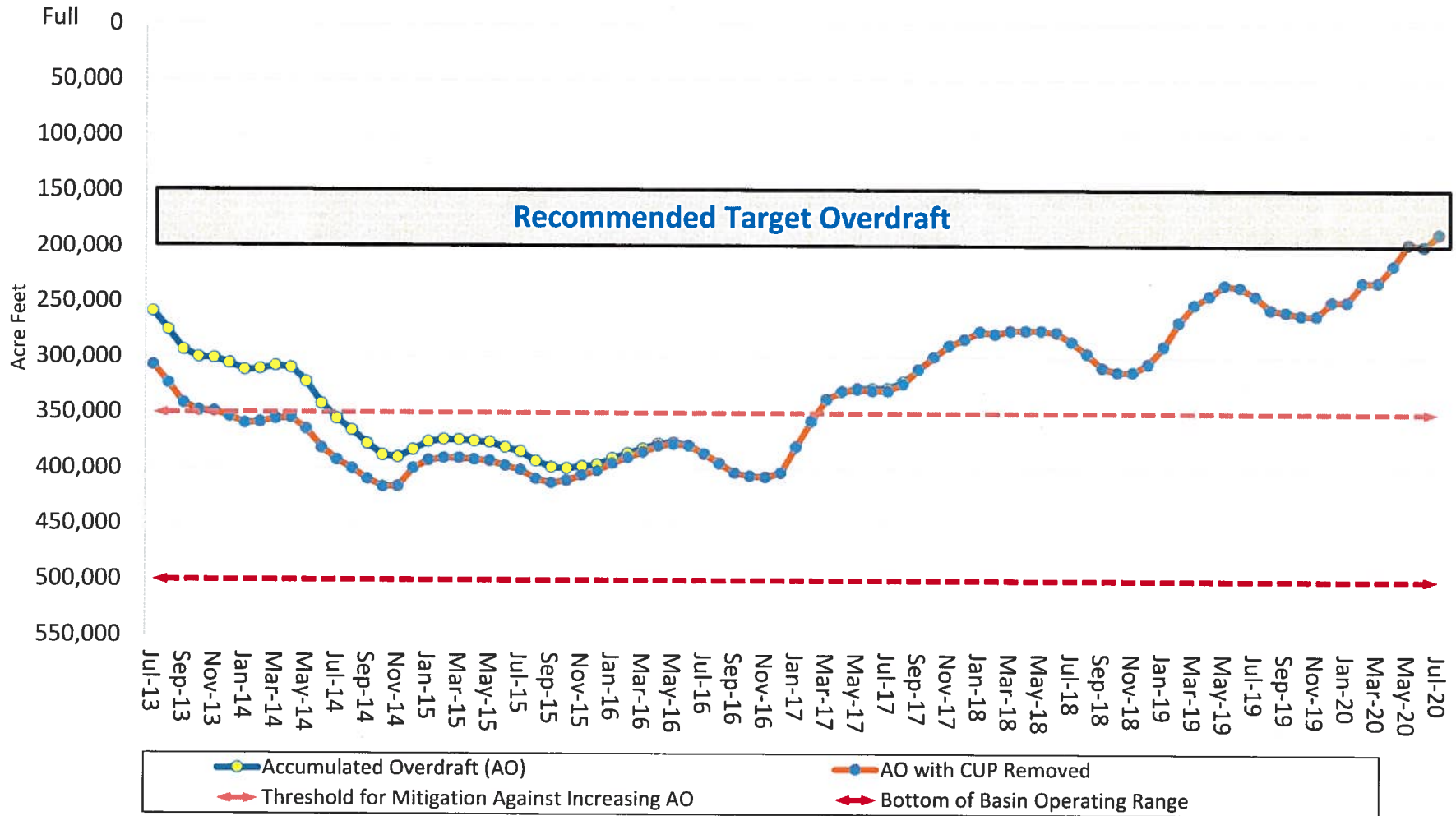

## Accumulated Overdraft of the OCWD Groundwater Basin as of July 2020

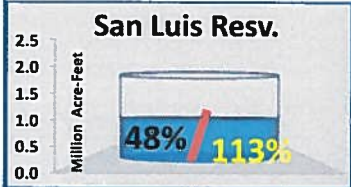
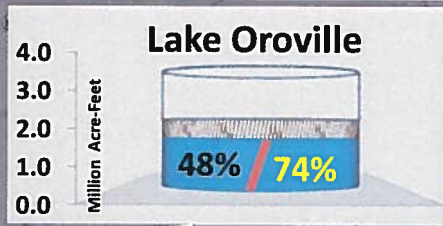
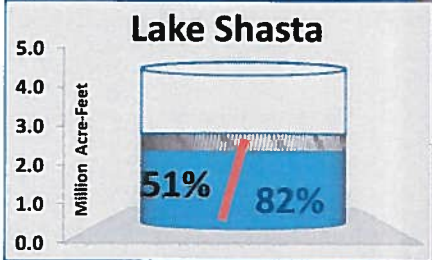

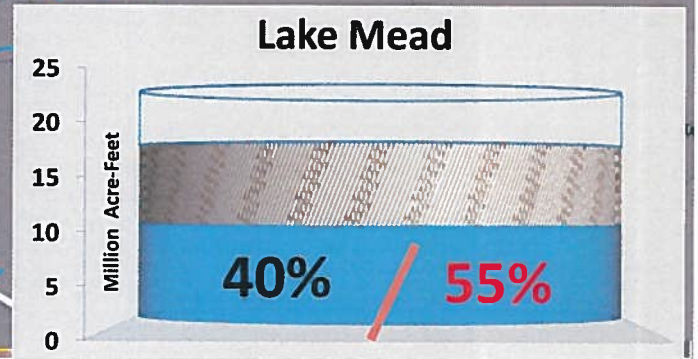
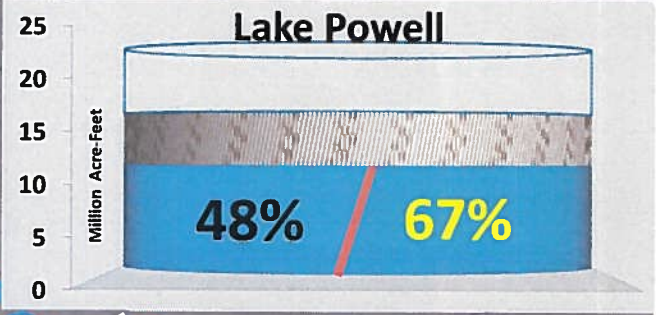
**State Water Project, Colorado River, and MWD Reservoir Storage**

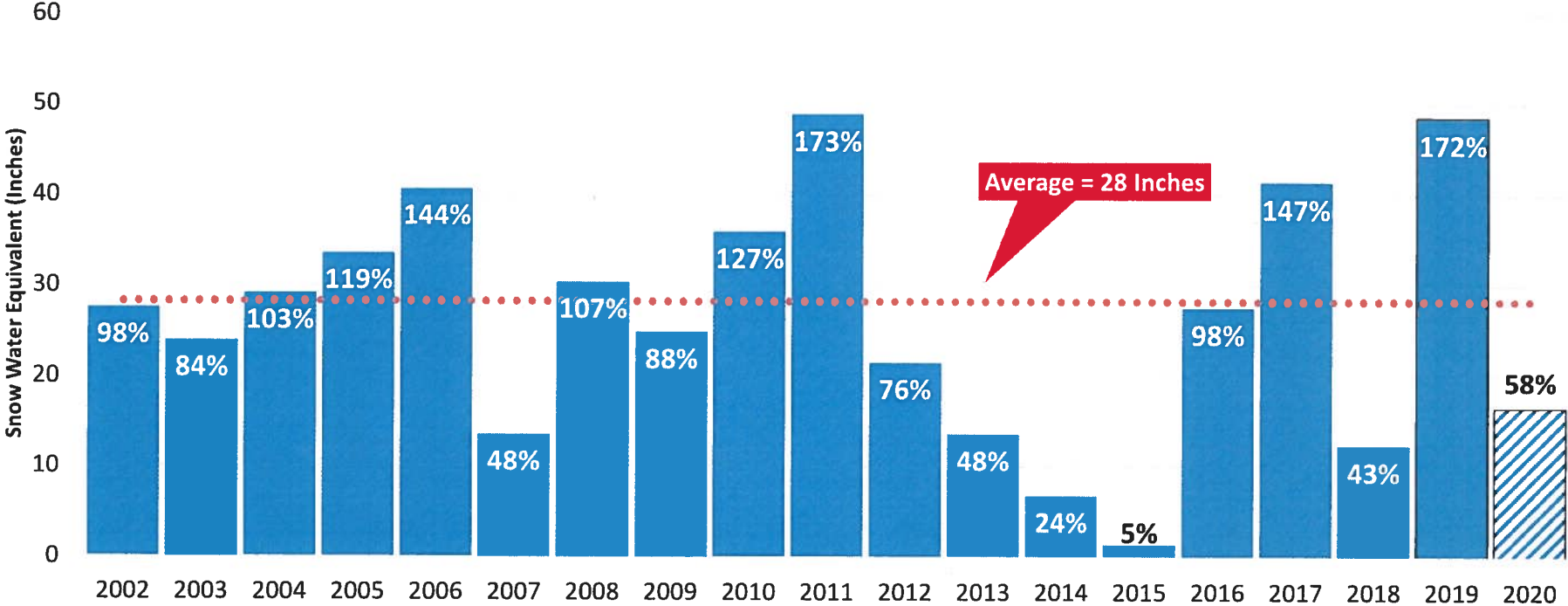

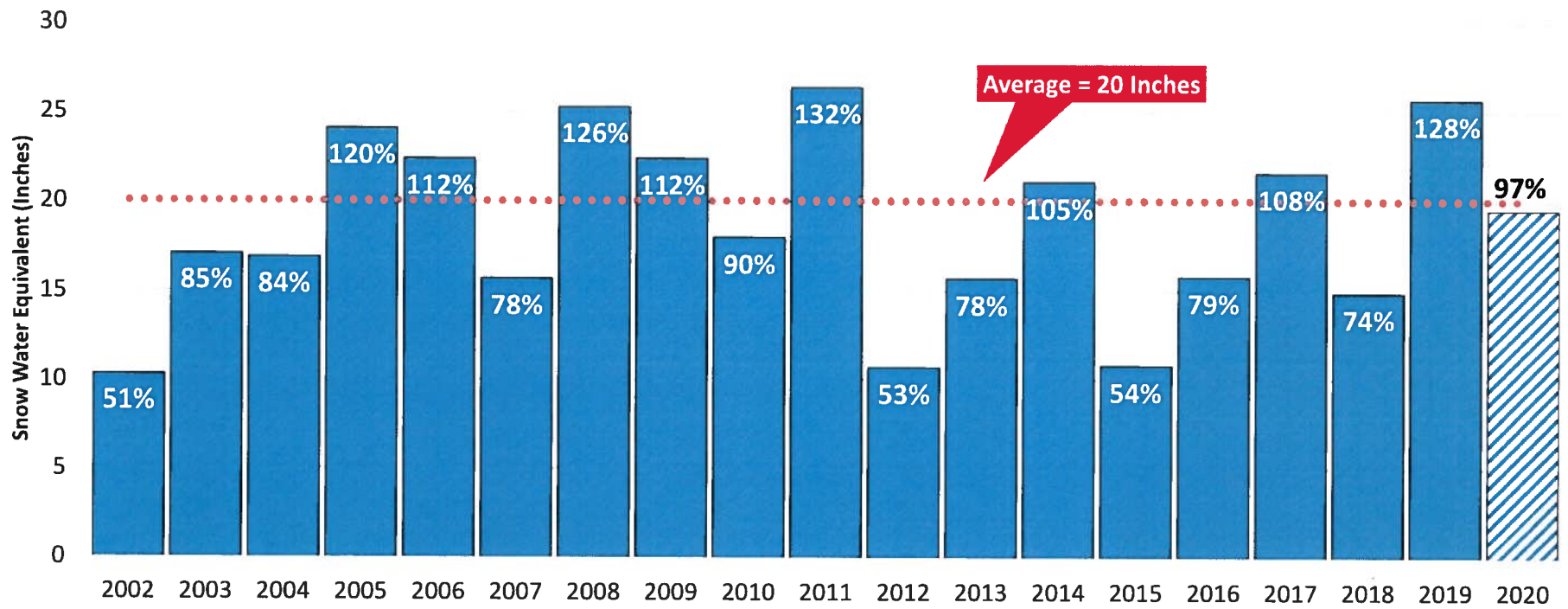

### Historical Northern California April 1st Peak Snow Water Equivalent

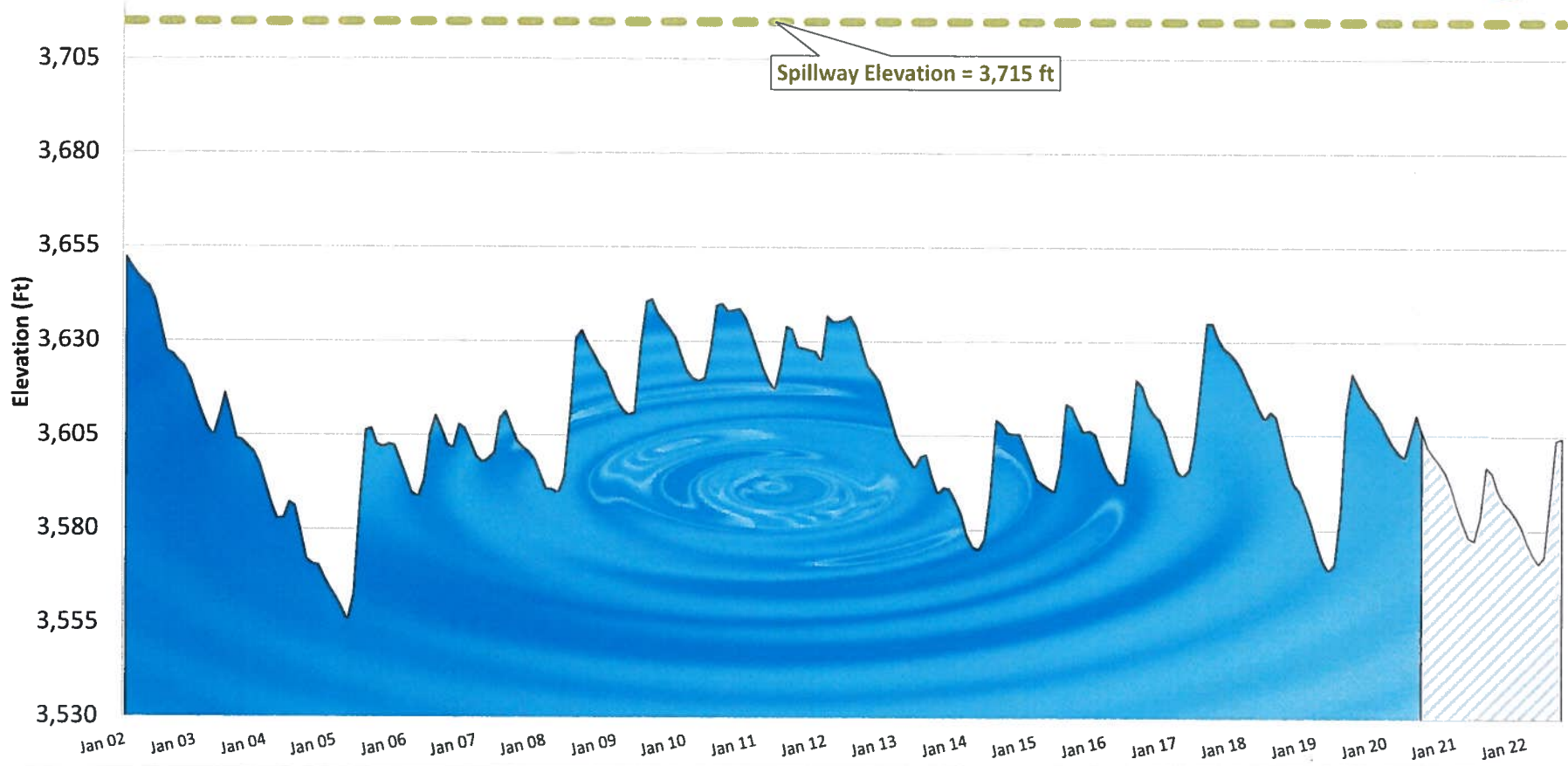


### Historical Colorado Basin April 15th Peak Snow Water Equivalent



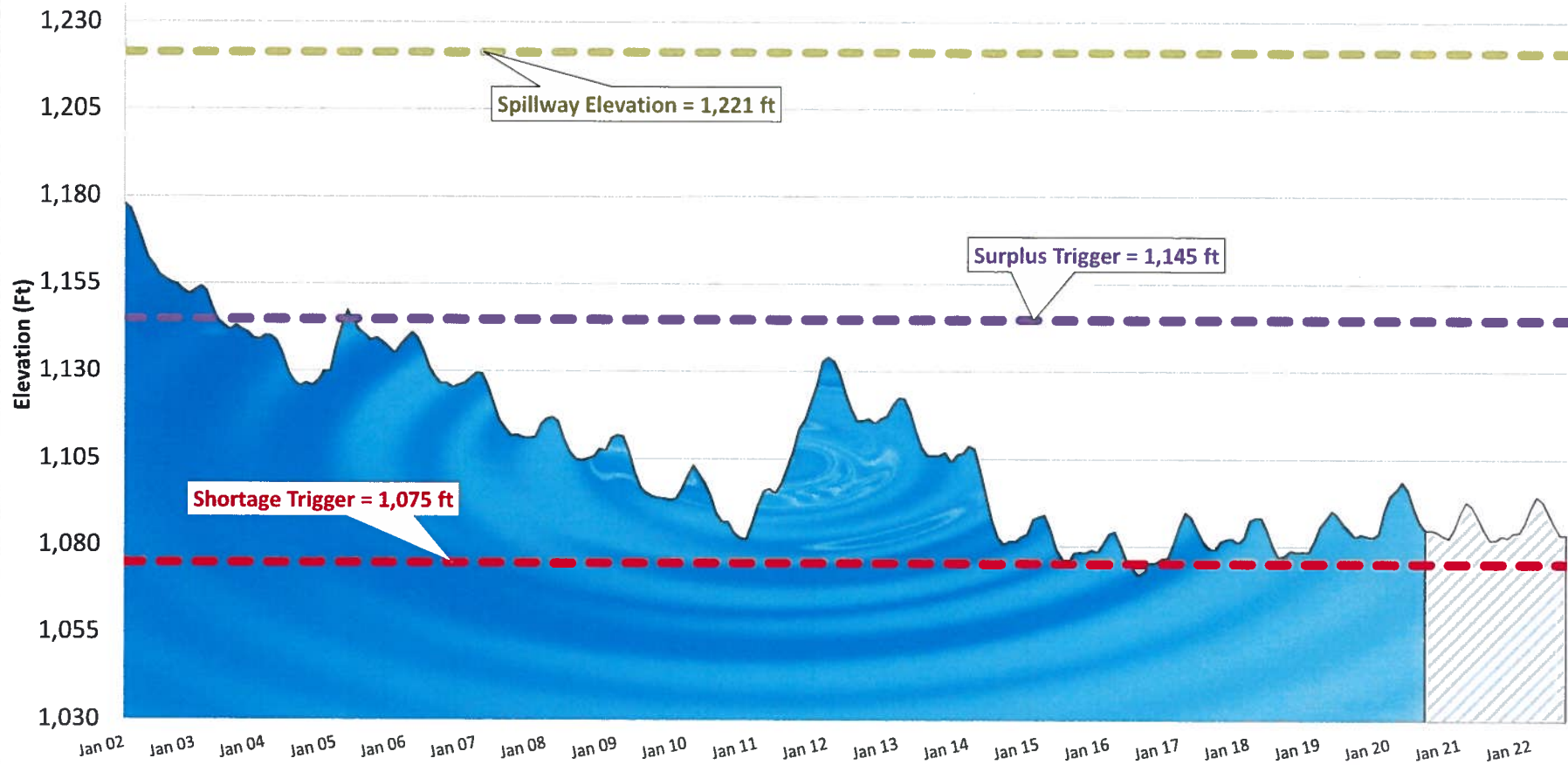
## Lake Powell Levels: Historical and Projected projection per USBR 24-Month Study

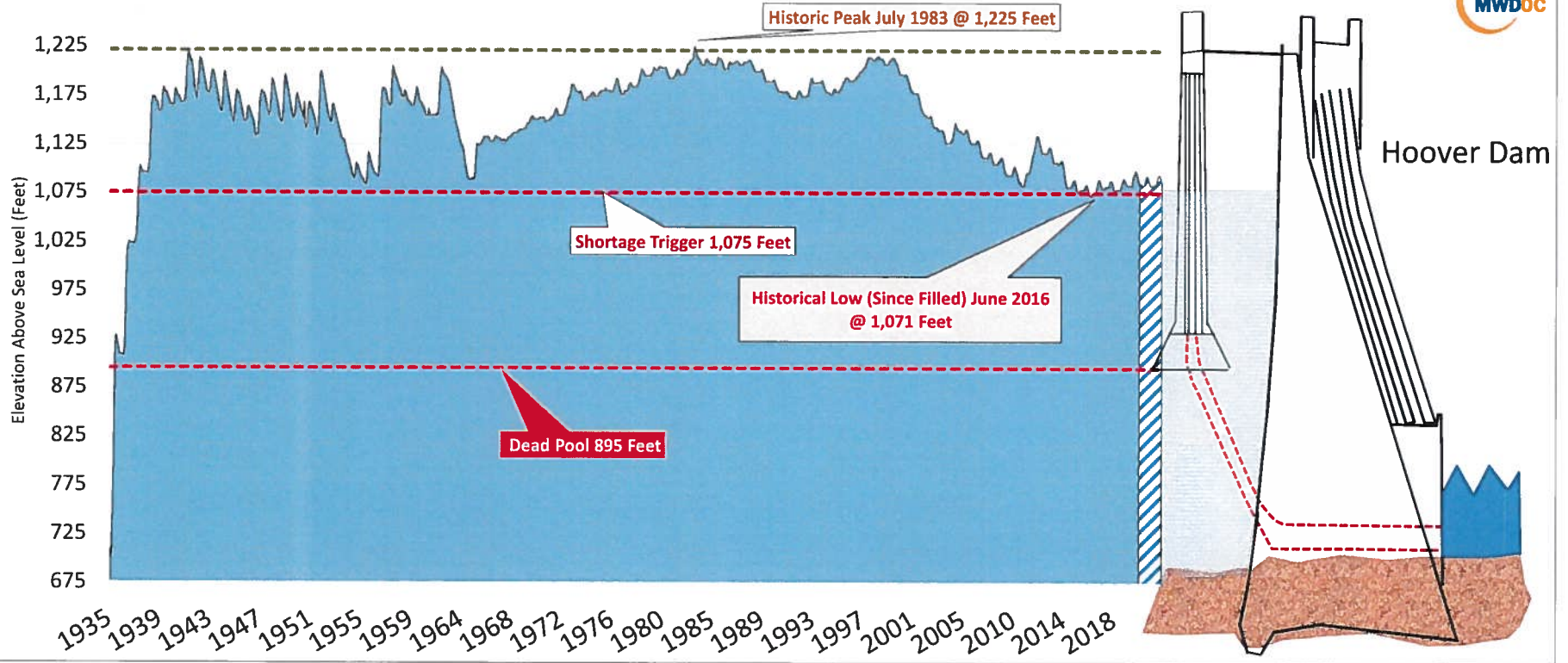


## Lake Mead Levels: Historical and Projected projection per USBR 24-Month Study

**Preparation work for track installation is ongoing in Segment 2. Preparation work requires full lane and parking closures on Santa Ana Boulevard from Raitt Street to Shelton Street.**

- Full closure of the north side of Santa Ana Boulevard
- Full parking closure along the north side of Santa Ana Boulevard
- Shift of a single lane of eastbound traffic to the south side of Santa Ana Boulevard
- Westbound traffic is detoured north or south starting at Bristol Street

**Foundation installation for the poles necessary to carry the overhead wiring of the OC Streetcar will continue along the streetcar route**

- Construction activities include excavation, trenching, concrete pours and road work and restoration
- Tree trimming and tree removals may be necessary along the streetcar route. Crews will follow all necessary guidelines for monitoring possible bird nesting's with an arborist
- Temporary parking and lane closures may be in place

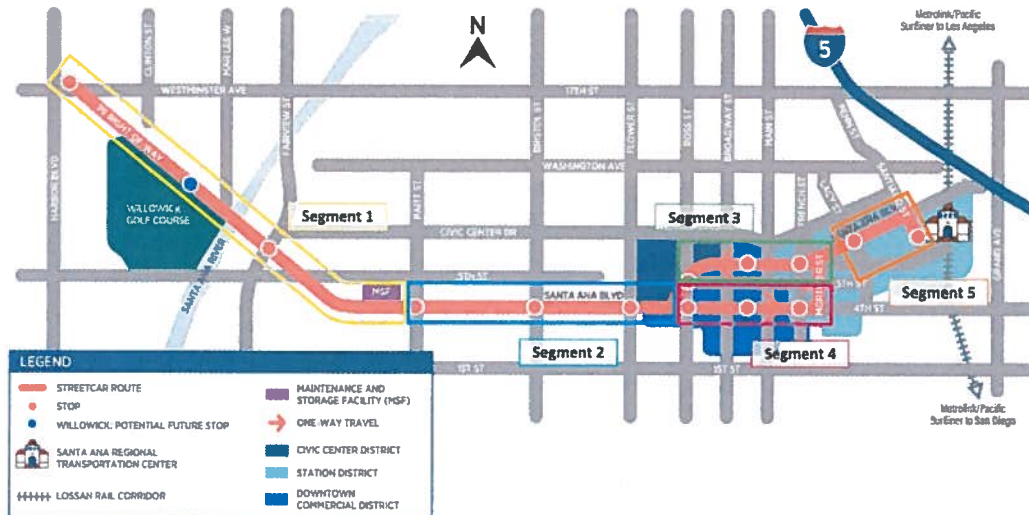
**Water pipeline and storm drain work will continue along the streetcar route**

- Construction activities include excavation, trenching, installation of water pipelines and storm drains, and road work and restoration
- Temporary parking and lane restrictions may be in place

Access will be maintained for all residents and businesses. Construction activities are dependent on weather and resource availability.

## SEGMENT 1 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

### Intersection of Harbor Blvd. and Westminister Ave. to Raitt St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 1 construction activities will include:

- Preliminary work at the site of the future Maintenance Storage Facility
- Storm drain installation within the PEROW
- Water pipeline installation at Harbor Boulevard
- Santa Ana River Bridge construction
- Westminster Avenue Bridge construction

**Water pipeline work will require temporary detours as well as lane closures at Harbor Boulevard near the PEROW.**

## SEGMENT 2 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

### Raitt St. to Parton St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 2 construction activities will include:

- Preparation for track installation on W. Santa Ana Boulevard from Raitt Street to Bristol Street
- Manhole installation on Raitt Street
- Tree trimming at city arborist approved locations along W. Santa Ana Boulevard from Raitt Street to Parton Street

**Preparation work for track installation will require a full closure of the north side of W. Santa Ana Boulevard, eastbound traffic will be shifted to the south side of W. Santa Ana Boulevard. Westbound traffic will be detoured north or south at Bristol Street. Additionally, a parking closure on the north side of W. Santa Ana Boulevard will be in place.**

## SEGMENT 3 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

### Ross St. to Mortimer St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 3 construction activities will include:

- Water pipeline installation on W. Santa Ana Boulevard and Bush Street
- Storm drain installation on Broadway from 3rd Street to W. Santa Ana Boulevard
- Storm drain installation on Main Street from 3rd Street to W. Santa Ana Boulevard
- Tree trimming at city arborist approved locations along W. Santa Ana Boulevard from Ross Street to Mortimer Street

**Storm drain and water pipeline installation will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on Broadway, W. Santa Ana Boulevard and Main Street**

## **SEGMENT 4 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES**

**Ross St. to Mortimer St.**

Over the next two weeks, Segment 4 construction activities will include:

- Potholing for sewer pipeline installation on 4th Street between French Street and Mortimer Street
- Sewer pipeline installation will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on French Street and 4th Street**

## **SEGMENT 5 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES**

**Mortimer St. to SARTC**

Over the next two weeks, Segment 5 construction activities will include:

- Fire service installation and testing on E. Santa Ana Boulevard at Minter Street and at Garfield Street
- Water pipeline installation and testing on E. Santa Ana Boulevard and Santiago Street
- Tree trimming at city arborist approved locations along E. Santa Ana Boulevard from Mortimer Street to SARTC

**Water pipeline and fire service installation will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on E. Santa Ana Boulevard and Santiago Street.**

# More schools announce plans for returning to campuses

The Register is tracking the status of campus reopenings and will update readers online

It is expected that Orange County schools will be allowed to resume in-person education as of Oct. 22, and district leaders have been busy making plans for when their campuses might begin a transition from students learning exclusively online.

The Orange County Register is monitoring the status of those plans and will continue to update our readers. The full listing can be found at [ocregister.com/tag/education](http://ocregister.com/tag/education), but here is some new information we have:

- The Anaheim Union High School District expects instruc-

tion will need to remain online-only for now as the district monitors the number of COVID-19 cases in its community. No date for in-person instruction has been determined.

- Garden Grove Unified School District, Orange County's third largest district, reversed its stance Tuesday on reopening for in-person instruction and will remain in distance learning mode until further notice. The district had targeted early October for starting some on-campus learning.

- The Ocean View School District says its hybrid of online and in-person instruction will begin Sept. 28.

- Saddleback Valley Unified School District set Sept. 29 as the starting date for hybrid learning that would have students rotating in morning and afternoon groups in person or splitting which days they would be on campus.

# Garden Grove man is first West Nile death of year in OC

An elderly man from Garden Grove is Orange County's first West Nile virus-related death in 2020, county health officials reported Wednesday.

A news release issued by the Orange County Health Care Agency about the man's death did not give his name or age, or the date he died.

In 2019, one Orange County resident died from complications of West Nile virus; there were seven reported cases.

West Nile virus is a mosquito-borne infection with such symptoms as fever, headache, body aches and fatigue. More serious signs of West Nile virus-related neuroinvasive disease include neck stiffness, confusion, muscle weakness and vision loss.

The Garden Grove man was one of five reported cases so far this year of people with West Nile virus symptoms, and four of them were

hospitalized, according to the health care agency. Two of the people had neuroinvasive disease; three had fever. Most people with West Nile virus do not experience any symptoms.

Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District has seen increased mosquito activity this year — especially in the communities of Anaheim, Buena Park, Fullerton and La Habra — and an uptick in dead birds infected with West Nile virus. Insecticides have been sprayed in several areas to reduce the mosquito population.

The district encourages residents to take precautionary steps that include:

- Empty standing water.
- Repairing windows and screens.
- Wearing long sleeve shirts and pants outdoors.
- Applying repellent to avoid mosquito bites.

# Want to Help Shape Policy? Now Is the Time to Review Which Policy Committee Is Right for You

September 15, 2020

The League is looking for city officials to help identify collective community issues and be part of the League's policy planning process to ensure a stronger impact for cities in the state Legislature.

It is important to have diverse representation on each committee to reflect the entire state while setting the foundation for the League's advocacy goals each year. Policy committee appointments will begin in mid-October following the League's annual conference and induction of new department, division and caucus presidents. Those interested in serving on a policy committee should start by reviewing which policy area is of interest.

## Policy Committees

- Community Services: Reviews issues related to child care, parks and recreation, libraries, natural disaster preparation, cultural arts and community and human services programs.
- Environmental Quality: Reviews issues related to air, water and water quality, CEQA, solid waste and recycling, hazardous materials, coastal issues, utilities, and wildfires.
- Governance, Transparency and Labor Relations: Reviews issues related to transparency, technology (open data), healthcare, elections and political reform, pension and workers compensation reform as well as other labor related issues.
- Housing, Community and Economic Development: Reviews issues related to general plans and zoning, housing, homelessness, rent control, land use regulation and development fees.
- Public Safety: Reviews issues related to law enforcement, fire and life safety policies including emergency communications, and emergency services including ambulance and disaster preparedness.
- Revenue and Taxation: Reviews issues related to finance administration, taxation reform, revenue needs and revenue sources.
- Transportation, Communication and Public Works: Reviews issues related transportation planning, technology, funding, construction, public works, telecommunications and other related areas.

The League's policy committees are comprised of over 400 elected and appointed city officials and local leaders from throughout the state. League bylaws provide that each division has two appointments and each department has one appointment. The League president may appoint up to 16 members to each policy committee.

The time commitment involves three to four meetings, beginning in January and ending at the conclusion of the League's annual conference. The January and April meetings will be held virtually, and the June meeting is under consideration for meeting either virtually or in person. A list of meeting dates will be available on the League's [Policy Committees webpage](#) in mid-December.

## **How to Apply or Reapply to Be a Policy Committee Member**

For current League policy committee members who would like to be reappointed, please send a request to the incoming division, department or caucus president. Reappointments are not automatic and must be requested each year. For those joining a policy committee for the first time, the process is the same. Policy committee appointment requests should be made to incoming division, department or caucus presidents. If those slots are already filled, you may request an appointment from the League board president.

Presidential appointments should only be requested when division, department or caucus appointment slots are already filled. If you did not receive an appointment through those channels, you may request a League presidential appointment by filling out a policy committee presidential appointment request form. This form will be available on the League website Nov. 16.

## **Application Dates and Contact Information**

- **Mid-October:** All League members interested in serving on one of the League's policy committees should request an appointment through their incoming division, department or caucus president. For division appointments, contact your [regional public affairs manager](#); for a department appointment, contact the League staff that [manages your department](#) and for a caucus appointment; contact the incoming [caucus president](#).
- **Nov. 1-13:** Division, department and caucus presidents will notify city officials who expressed interest in serving on a League policy committee whether they were appointed to their requested policy committee.
- **Nov. 16:** League members NOT appointed through a division, department or caucus can request a League board presidential appointment by completing an online application form available Nov. 16 on the [League's Policy Committees webpage](#).
- **Dec. 4:** Deadline for League members to submit the online League board presidential application form.

**All League members appointed to a policy committee will be notified by the end of December.**
