Extreme Volunteerism for Neighborhood Makeover

With paint brushes and shovels in hand, over 300 volunteers from the Living Springs Christian Fellowship and the Islamic Society of Orange County spent a Sunday in the Woodbury Park neighborhood giving eight homes much-needed makeovers. Home exteriors and iron fences were painted, shrubs were planted, and irrigation was installed. Homeowners unable to improve the outside of their homes due to age or income limitations were selected by the City's Neighborhood Improvement Committee. The area has a history of high volume Code Enforcement complaints and police-related service calls. Residents met with the committee to help identify ways to remedy some of the conditions. Clean-up sponsors included 7-Eleven, Home Depot, and the Garden Grove Tourism Promotion Corporation.



Breaking Ground at Twin Lakes Park

Set for completion in November 2013, a \$25 million facelift is underway at Twin Lakes Park, courtesy of state grant and County of Orange park funds. A brand new pumping station will be in place, providing decades of flood protection to the surrounding community, as well as many amenities for residents to enjoy. They include picnic shelters overlooking the lake, soccer fields, new landscaping, jogging trails, and the replacement of exercise equipment.



Where the Rubber Meets the Road

A Caltrans pavement rehab project along both directions of Beach Boulevard will impact Garden Grove drivers through the end of October. The project limits are Lincoln and Acacia Avenues. An overlay of rubberized hot mix asphalt will be placed atop the existing road. Lane closures will occur, but two lanes will remain open. Night work will be done from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. and daytime work will be performed from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Upon completion, motorists will enjoy a smoother ride quality. Street Repair Goes Green

Four, formerly worn-and-torn arterial streets in Garden Grove are currently undergoing improvements using a unique and environmentally-friendly technique. The street reconstruction comes courtesy of full depth reclamation, or FDR, a process that recycles the asphalt and base materials. Once pulverized, they are mixed with cement and water, and compacted to produce a stronger, more durable base. FDR prolongs the life of the pavement while reducing future costs. Sections of the new and improved streets are:

- Westminster Ave. Bushard Ave. to Brookhurst St.
- Brookhurst St. Hazard Ave. to Westminster Ave.
- Chapman Ave. 9th St. to West St.
- Trask Ave. Harbor Blvd. to 22 freeway on-ramp
