CRIME TREND:

TARGETED BURGLARY

Be alert when withdrawing money from ATMs or bank, as criminals often watch and victimize patrons whom they believe to have large sums of cash. Protect yourself by staying observant and aware of your surroundings.

Consider the following when visiting a bank:



- Be on the lookout for suspicious people watching you when withdrawing cash from a bank or an ATM.
- When driving home after a cash withdrawal, watch for cars that may be following you. Switch up your routine by taking different routes home.
- Avoid carrying large sums of cash on your person unless you're going to the bank to make a deposit.
- If you are a business owner, avoid storing cash on site. Designate a trusted employee to deposit cash at the bank at random times of the day and week.
- Always know your location, such as major cross streets and landmarks.
- Call 9-1-1 and begin driving towards the nearest police station if you believe you are being followed.
